

THE NEVADA DEPARTMENT OF SENTENCING POLICY

was established in 2019 to:

- Assist the Sentencing Commission in making data-driven recommendations regarding sentencing in Nevada
- Identify variables or sets of data which are not currently collected/shared across NV agencies of criminal justice



NEVADA SENTENCING COMMISSION

Advises the Legislature on proposed legislation and makes recommendations with respect to all matters relating to the elements of this State's system of criminal justice which affect the sentences imposed for felonies and gross misdemeanors.



NEVADA LOCAL JUSTICE REINVESTMENT COORDINATION COUNCIL

Advises the NSC at the local-government level, identifying county-level programming and treatment needs for justice-involved individuals to assist in reducing recidivism. Makes recommendation regarding grants to local government and nonprofit organizations.



MISDEMEANOR SUBCOMMITTEE

Established by Senate Bill 103 (2023) to:




Senate Bill 103 (2023)

Revised NRS 176 to establish the Misdemeanor Subcommittee to:

- (a) Study existing laws, policies and practices relating to misdemeanor offenses in this State and other states, including, without limitation, the sentences imposed for misdemeanor offenses in this State and other states; and
- (b) Submit a biennial report describing the findings, conclusions and recommendations of the subcommittee to the Sentencing Commission.

Subcommittee Mission

The mission of the Nevada Sentencing Commission, Subcommittee on Misdemeanors is to undertake a comprehensive review of misdemeanor offenses in Nevada, in order to make data-informed, substantive recommendations to promote justice and fairness across all misdemeanor systems in this State.



Nevada Local Justice Reinvestment Grant

Assembly Bill 388 (2023)

- **†** \$3,000,000 appropriation to NDSP/NLJRCC to award for programs related to reducing recidivism
- Targeting all 17 counties / Applications from nine
- **†** Amount requested = \$2,337,855
- Currently approved = \$233,292
- † \$588,422 currently in Review Committee process
- ₱ Two more rounds for accepting grant applications: close Friday, June 7 and Friday, June 21, 2024







BASELINE DATA (INFORMATIONAL ONLY)

The following data does NOT represent convictions resulting from Senate Bill 35 (2023). As stated previously, there are no Senate Bill 35-qualifying NDOC admissions presently. These graphs are based on NDOC admissions after July 1, 2023, and represent crimes committed prior to the July 1, 2023, effective date of Senate Bill 35 (2023). The data does, however, give a baseline for the number of individuals who would conceivably be eligible for conviction under this law if the crime had been committed after July 1, 2023.






Note: The weights listed are as reported in the criminal offense summary. No explanation of testing methods or actual substance purity is available.








Notice of Intent to Seek the Death Penalty




SB 316 Final Case Disposition



NDSP Post-Conviction Population Projections







NDOC Population Age Groups






April 2024 NDOC Population Race & Ethnicity

NDOC Population by Felony Category








NDOC Population by Offense Group



NDOC Total Population by Age






• The aging population represented 13.75% of the total population in December of 2017 and 16.11% in 2023.

Impact of Aging Population


- Defined to be offenders 55+

 - Cost of appropriate staffing and facilities


Total Population Felony Category Trends






Total Population Offense Group Trends




