

Completion Times for Public Records Requests






Fulfilling Requests

Increasing Demand for Information

- These requests come from the media, citizens, lawyers, students and researchers, and commercial businesses.
- 96% Surge in Public Records Inquiries (2020-2023): Highlighting the growing demand from both media and the public.

Volume of Requests

- The HPD PIO receives approximately 7-15 requests a week for body camera footage, 911 calls, photo redactions, and police report requests from the media.





City of Henderson Fee Schedule

Fee Structure

- Fees for any records request are based on the actual cost required to conduct research and complete the request.
- The Chief of Police may waive the fees for any reason upon request.
- Most public records are available for inspection at no charge.

Free Research Time

- Requesters receive the first 30 minutes of research free.

Body Camera Video Redacting

Officer Faces Redaction

- Each officer's face must be redacted according to NRS 289, the Police Officers Bill of Rights.

Factors Affecting Redaction

- Different lighting conditions can complicate redaction.
- Movement of officers can add complexity to the process.
- The presence of multiple officers increases the redaction workload.
- Reflections of officers' faces in the scene need to be considered.
- Additional sensitive content in the video may also impact the redaction process.
- Public Information Officers (PIOs) must also listen to videos to redact sensitive information being stated.

Redaction Time

- Redacting a 5-minute video: 30 minutes to several hours.
- Time varies based on complexity and content factors.







Henderson Police Department's Public Information Office (PIO)

Staffing

- The PIO is currently staffed with:
 - > Two sworn officers.
 - ➤ One part-time Law Enforcement Support Specialist (LESS) from the Police Records Unit (up to 19 hours a week, as of January 2024).

The PIO office handles:

- Public Records and media requests for:
 - ➤ Video, Bodycam footage, Dashcam footage, 3-1-1 and 9-1-1 audio, Photo requests
- -Additional Responsibilities:
 - Coordinating interviews and on-scene briefings.
 - Issuing news releases and public service announcements.
 - ➤ Managing and posting on social media accounts.

Role of Law Enforcement Support Specialist (LESS)

- The LESS position was created to assist with media requests for police reports.
- The LESS has been crucial in handling the office's workload for audio requests, video requests, and photo requests and redactions.



Large Commercial Requests

Requests from Commercial Media

- The Henderson Police Department has recently received requests from large production companies for body camera footage and case reports.
- Two large production companies from Canada and the UK recently requested all documents from a homicide case that the Henderson Police Department solved.

• Resource and Cost Impact

- Fulfilling this request would take over a week (40 hours) for a PIO officer to complete.
- Commercial requests compete with the limited resources needed to fulfill requests from the public.



Henderson Police Department's Commitment to Transparency

Positive Relationship

- The Henderson Police Department strives for transparency and cooperation in all interactions with the media and the public.

Body Camera Footage Requests

- Aim to accommodate requests for body camera footage in a timely manner.
- Factors affecting availability:
 - Queueing of requests.
 - > Complexity of redactions.
 - ➤ Number of bodycams requested.
 - ➤ Other operational considerations.
