Charges

Revenue from all public \$414,567 records requests FY 23 (includes subpoenas)

Costs to operate PRU FY23 \$1,968,277



Turnaround Time

- Highly dependent on volume of material and level of redactions
- Day-to-day arrest report and booking photo to media: within hours to a few days, depending on the circumstances
- BWC for matter of widespread public interest: start releasing in batches;
 completed within a few weeks
- BWC for average traffic accident: could be longer
- Request for voluminous reports: could be months



Challenges

- Increasing volume of footage
- Increasing number of requests
- Increasing breadth of requests
- Redactions



Redactions

- Criminal history information (non-media)
- Sex assault victims
- Juvenile justice

- Privacy concerns (homes, gruesome images, never arrested, etc)
- Law enforcement concerns (safety, open investigations, etc)
- Personal identifying information
