## Children's Mental Health Services

- Early Childhood Mental Health Consultation (ages 0-6)
- Early Childhood Day Treatment Program (ages 3-6)
- Latency Day Treatment Program (ages 7-11)
- Mobile Crisis Response Teams
- Intensive In-Home Clinical Team
- Screening
- Wraparound in Nevada
- Early Childhood Mental Health Services
- Children's Clinical Services (ages 6-17)



# Inpatient Facilities

- Desert Willow Treatment Center: a state-licensed psychiatric hospital for children
- PRTF North: a state-licensed psychiatric residential treatment facility (PRTF)
- Enterprise: a state-licensed PRTF that is currently vacant
- Bamboo Sunrise: A private vendor operating in a DCFS building as a residential treatment facility. Intended to provide services that were provided by Oasis, formerly the DCFS PRTF



## Other Facilities and Resources

- Funded an ICF and leased building to Clark County for boys with significant needs related to developmental disabilities (6 bed residential setting)
- Proposal to renovate a building on the West Charleston Campus that may be used for girls with developmental disabilities (6 bed residential setting)
- ARPA Funding
  - Connect Nevada, care coordination provided by Magellan to support children and families who are at-risk for out of home placements or other family disruption
  - Peer Support Services (Youth and Family) through Nevada PEP
  - Latency Day Treatment



# Challenges and Gaps

#### Safety Net Provider

- Lack of access due to providers not enrolled in Medicaid
- 2. Complex behavioral, developmental and psychiatric needs for youth
- 3. Juvenile justice involved youth with behavioral, development and psychiatric needs
- 4. Lack of third-party entities to manage facilities such as Enterprise

#### 2. Staffing

- 1. DCFS has significant vacancies in Desert Willow and in non-residential programs
- 2. Private sector has closed wings and facilities due to the cost of doing business

#### 3. Step-Down Facilities

- 1. Qualified Residential Treatment Programs
- Intermediate Care Facilities
- 3. Partial Hospitalization Program
- 4. Intensive Outpatient Program
