Early Childhood Mental Health Consultation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Age range: Ages 0-6</li> <li>○ Scope: In-classroom observation assessment, recommendations for classroom and home, referrals to additional services, modeling in classroom, case management, training to early care and education professionals</li> <li>○ Timeframe: 2 weeks to 90 days dependent on specific family need</li> </ul>	Early care and education settings	Child Care Development Fund - Pays for personnel only. Early Childhood Mental Health Services	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Early Childhood Mental Health Services (ECMHS) provides services to children between birth and 8 years of age with emotional disturbance or risk factors for emotional disturbances and associated developmental delays. The goal of services is to strengthen parent-child relationships, support the family's capacity to care for their children, and to enhance the child's social and emotional functioning.</li> <li>○ Scope: Weekly 50- 60-minute outpatient therapy services utilizing evidence-based and evidence-informed therapeutic interventions with the youth and family.</li> <li>○ Timeframe: Dependent on the youth and their identified needs. Early Childhood Day Treatment Program	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ The Day Treatment Program is a therapeutic social group setting for children aged 3-6 with severe social and emotional concerns.</li> <li>○ Provides a stable and structured setting for children to work toward building age-appropriate developmental skills to support continued success in the home, school, and community. The Day Treatment Program provides group therapy for children that aims to encourage relationship building, encourages problem solving with peers (peaceful classroom model), working through challenging feelings and more.</li> <li>○ Aimed at supporting children who are struggling to make progress in therapy services, before further behavioral challenges arise in later years.</li> <li>○ Scope: Intensive outpatient service. Four days per week for two hours per day.</li> <li>○ Timeframe: 6 months to 12 months depending on the child's progress.</li> </ul>	Clark County at DCFS locations on North Craig and South Henderson outpatient clinics. Intensive In-Home Clinical Team	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ The program is designed for youth with complex behavioral health needs and multi-system involvement. Teams are in contact with the youth, family, and systems multiple times a week for extended periods of time. 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Screening	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Psychiatric Caseworkers at each site provide intake coordination for all programs within Southern and Northern Nevada Child/Adolescent Services for ECMHS and Children's Clinical Services (CCS). Caregivers and legal guardians may speak directly with a trained and caring Psychiatric Caseworker who listens to the family's needs and helps to connect and navigate to the level of service needed in DCFS and within the community.</li> <li>○ For youth who have open cases with ECMHS or CCS: Foundational phase assessments that include screeners for parents such as the Beck Depression Inventory (BDI), Life Stressor Checklist (LSC) and the PTSD Symptom Scale, Interview (PSSI). Mobile Crisis Response Team	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Crisis is defined by the caller</li> <li>○ Crisis assessment and stabilization, safety planning, intensive care coordination</li> <li>○ Ages 0-18 (need to work on expansion to age 21)</li> <li>○ Services provided at the family's preferred location</li> <li>○ Services initiated within 60 minutes unless family chooses otherwise</li> <li>○ Services can last up to 60 days</li> </ul>	Statewide	Medicaid  <a href="https://knowcrisis.com">https://knowcrisis.com</a> North: 775-688-1670 South: 702-486-7865 Rural Nevada: 702-486-7865

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Wraparound in Nevada	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Wraparound In Nevada (WIN) is a statewide, community-based program that offers a tiered care coordination approach to serving children and youth with Severe Emotional Disturbances (SED) and complex behavioral and mental health needs. Using evidence-based and evidence-informed model approaches, the overall goal of WIN is to provide individualized and strength-based support for children, youth, and families in reaching their goals or “family visions” with a decrease in need for higher levels of care, including out-of-home placements.</li> </ul>	Statewide	Medicaid  <a href="mailto:dcfs-win.referral@dcfs.nv.gov">dcfs-win.referral@dcfs.nv.gov</a>

Desert Willow Treatment Center	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Desert Willow Treatment Center is a 44-bed psychiatric hospital accredited by the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Health Care Organizations that provides mental health treatment for children and adolescents aged 6 to 17 years old. The facility is licensed by the Bureau of Health Care Quality and Compliance and is currently licensed for a 12-bed acute psychiatric care unit, an 8-bed pediatric Residential Treatment Center (RTC) unit servicing 6–11-year-old patients, and two 12-bed Residential Treatment Center (RTC) units servicing 12–17-year-old patients. DWTC’s mission is to promote positive self-growth, create change in behavior, attitudes, values, and ways of thinking through education, therapeutic treatment, and appropriate medical and mental health services.</li> </ul>	Las Vegas	General Fund, Medicaid, Private Insurance  702-486-8900
