Nevada Commission on Innovation and Excellence in Education (CIEE)

Purpose

The CIEE was established by Senate Bill 425 during Nevada's 82nd Legislative Session. The bill established the CIEE to develop a statewide vision and implementation plan to improve the public education system in Nevada. The CIEE is charged with comparing Nevada's education policies with those of high-performing education systems globally and domestically.

This builds on a national conversation among legislators.



2014

Partnering with NCSL, NCEE led a cohort of state legislators in learning about high-performing education systems globally and exploring possible applications for improving education systems in their states.

2016

Their work resulted in a call to action for states to think more systemically and globally about education.

No Time to Lose: How to Build a World-Class Education System State by State 2020-2022

NCEE, with NCSL and SREB co-convened a new cohort of state legislators that led to a follow up report, *The Time is Now* that:

- reaffirms the findings of No Time to Lose;
- frames the findings within the context of the upheaval caused by the pandemic;
- updates the insights with the latest education innovations; and
- renews the call to action with urgency.

The NCEE, NCSL, SREB partnership resulted in state legislatures across the nation designing and implementing new education policies and systems.


OUTCOMES

• **PISA Results:** The United States, including Nevada, lags behind top countries like Canada, Estonia, Singapore, and Japan in reading, math, and science.

Commission Goals

The CIEE is creating the policies needed to create a world-class, globally competitive, relevant, and adaptable education system.

This means ensuring every learner in Nevada can develop the knowledge and skills needed to prosper in an increasingly challenging and uncertain future.

The CIEE is intended to deliver on this bold promise of a worldclass, future-ready education for every Nevada learner.

Time Horizons

Getting to this goal will take time, perseverance, and adaptability. The CIEE has discussed its work along multiple time horizons:

- 2030 is the end-goal: a world-class education system for Nevada learners.
- The CIEE will also need to build in interim goals and action steps for 2028, with progress monitoring and opportunities to learn, adapt, and course-correct along the way.
- The CIEE is building the policy infrastructure needed to launch Nevada down that path starting in 2026.

How does this Commission connect to others?

The CIEE is charged with establishing the **future-facing policy framework** to ensure that Nevada's education system is world-class and globally competitive by 2030.

We recognize that the *Commission on School Funding*, which will get the current system fully funded now and in the coming years, is crucial for getting the CIEE's recommendations off the ground. Our work is still needed to: **establish a future-ready policy framework** that will ensure the Commission on School Funding's dollars are well-spent; and, **establishing a future roadmap and plan** for 2030 (and even beyond.)

The CIEE also builds on the work of the Blue Ribbon Commission that established the Nevada Future of Learning Network. The Nevada Portrait of a Learner serves as a guiding vision for the CIEE. Our work is in service of ensuring that Nevada has a **supportive and systemic policy framework** in place to realize the Portrait for every learner.

What is the CIEE doing?

Currently, the CIEE is engaged in discussing:

- How the future is changing—and will continue to change—for our young people and our educators.
- Ways the education system can adapt to meet the changing needs of the education system today, by stopping existing ineffective or misaligned policies and practices, or adopting new policies, incentives, structures, or supports.
- Existing strong work that can and should be built up, supported, and sustained.
- What can be put into place to enable Nevada's education system to remain nimble and adaptive in the face of an ever-changing future.

Portrait of a World-Class Teacher Subcommittee

Goals

- Address pervasive teacher shortages by making teaching a more attractive profession.
- Offer consistent opportunities for learning and growth and ensure that teachers are future-focused.
- Align teacher prep to the demands of the future.
- Create systemic supports for teacher development.
- Ensure all teachers have the competencies and skills to realize Nevada Portrait of a Learner.

- Consider incentives for districts to create more time for collaborative teacher professional learning.
- Learn about professional learning for school leaders in order to ensure that principals can develop teachers to do their best work.
- Align **prep & licensure renewal requirements** with the current and future demands of teaching.
- Explore teacher career progressions.
- Support teachers in using tech effectively.

Next Generation Career Pathways Subcommittee

Goals

- Ensure high-quality career pathways and exploration opportunities are available for all learners.
- Emphasize transferable skills and entrepreneurial experiences, integrated alongside academics.
- Ensure equitable access to quality pathways for all, even career exploration in early years.
- Coordinate at the systems level, across intermediaries, and among diverse education providers.

- Focus on transferable and entrepreneurial skills through work-based and project-based experiences.
- Offer career exploration and career exposure for all students, starting in middle school or earlier.
- Consider employer partnerships that enable rural and remote career-connected learning.
- Improve data collection and messaging to understand and communicate the impact of CTE.

Proficiency-Based Learning Subcommittee

Goals

- Make learning the constant; time the variable.
- Leverage opps in AB 110 and Future of Learning Network and ID opportunities for improvement.
- Ensure performance standards and learning progressions are clear and understandable to students, teachers, and communities.

- Dig into **the role of time** to determine how to make learning the constant and time the variable. How is current time mandated? How will it shift?
- Learn what high-quality professional learning is needed for teachers to build their capacity to engage students in this way.
- Examine the role of **high-quality leadership** in designing and leading schools with proficiency-based models at their core.

Measuring What Matters Subcommittee

Goals

- Align education goals with actionable performance metrics.
- Enhance public communication.
- Improve data transparency.
- Support not only struggling districts, but also continuous improvement at all education levels.

- Build system, district, and school-level metrics that incorporate durable skills and multiple ways to demonstrate knowledge.
- Investigate opportunities available within the **federal waiver process**.
- Build a public communications strategy, incorporating stakeholder analysis and storytelling, to communicate the outcomes of the system to business, community, families.

- A long-term vision for Nevada's education system.
- O An implementation plan and timeline.
- O Policy recommendations to the Nevada Department of Education, and legislative recommendations for sessions beyond the 83rd.
- O A proposal for ongoing systems evaluation.
- O Communications and stakeholder engagement plan.
