
#### **Division Mission**


## Accomplishments

  - Intensive in-home family services



### Major Enhancements

#### **Summit View Youth Center (3148):**

- Intake Assessment and Placement Center (E299): This request funds the development and implementation of a new Intake Assessment and Placement Center. When a youth is committed to the State, they undergo clinical screening and assessments to determine the most suitable placement. Currently, while awaiting the completion of screenings, assessments and subsequent transfer to a state facility for the detention of children or a behavioral health facility, these youth remain in county detention. Both the county and the youth would benefit from a streamlined process that transitions the youth from county to state care and custody allowing the committed youth to begin their program without unnecessary delays.



**Extended Young Adult Support Services (E251):** In 2008, Congress passed the Foster Connections to Success and Increasing Adoption Act. This law provided state the option to provide Extended Foster Care up to age 21 and receive federal Title IV-E funds to share the cost of foster care, adoption assistance, and kinship guardianship. This request supports all three of the child welfare agencies, including caseload and staffing.






Washoe County Human Services Agency – Non-Recurring Adoption Subsidy Caseload








Washoe County Human Services Agency – Family Foster Care Caseload






Washoe County Human Services Agency – Advanced Foster Care Caseload










Washoe County Human Services Agency – Court Jurisdiction Caseload




Washoe County Human Services Agency – KinGAP Caseload






Clark County Family Services – Adoption Subsidy Caseload






Clark County Family Services – Non-Recurring Adoption Subsidy Caseload









Rural Child Welfare – Adoption Subsidy Caseload






Rural Child Welfare – Non-Recurring Adoption Subsidy Caseload

#### **Rural Non-Recurring Adoption Subsidy**






Rural Child Welfare – Family Foster Care Caseload



## Facility and Service Populations

#### Children's Mental Health

- **Desert Willow Treatment Center** This treatment center is a licensed 54-bed psychiatric hospital, which provides mental health treatment to children throughout the state.
- Psychiatric Residential Treatment Facility (PRTF) North This facility provides 24-hour highly structured services for children and youth between ages 12-17 who are severely emotionally disturbed.

#### Juvenile Justice Facilities

- The Division provides programming and services to youth between the ages of 12-18
- Summit View Youth Center This facility serves as the maximum-security center for youth with a capacity of 48 beds. SVYC focuses on High School aged males between 14 and 19 years of age.
- Caliente Youth Center This facility is a staff-secure with a capacity of 80 beds, including five separate housing units for youth committed to the state for correctional care; CYC serves males and females ages 12-18.
- **Nevada Youth Training Center** This facility is a staff-secure, including seven separate housing units for youth committed to the state for correctional care. NYTC has the capacity to house 64 youth, female or male ages 12-18.
