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INTRODUCTION

This interim committee brief provides background information and summarizes major issues related to the Joint Interim Standing Committee (JISC) on the Judiciary. It includes information on the Committee's jurisdiction, membership, and schedule; anticipated topics for this interim; and relevant audits, reports, and studies.

POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE COMMITTEE

The Committee is authorized by subsection 1(f) of [Nevada Revised Statutes \(NRS\) 218E.320](#). The powers and duties of the Committee are codified in [NRS 218E.330](#). The Committee may: (1) review issues within the jurisdiction of the related standing committee or committees from the previous regular legislative session; (2) exercise the investigative powers provided in [NRS 218E.105](#) through [218E.140](#); and (3) conduct studies, within its budget, as directed by the Legislature or the Legislative Commission.

The Committee may request up to 15 bill draft requests (BDRs) for the 2027 Session, 5 of which must relate to matters relating to juvenile justice. The BDRs must be submitted to the Legal Division of the LCB on or before September 1, 2026. A work session will be conducted at the last Committee meeting, tentatively scheduled for August 25, 2026, during which Members will vote to submit certain BDRs. In

addition to BDRs, the Committee may vote to draft letters to relevant stakeholders and include policy statements in the final Committee report.

COMMITTEE JURISDICTION

The Committee has jurisdiction over a wide range of issues including cannabis, civil procedure, corrections, crimes and punishments, domestic relations, gaming, guardianships, human trafficking, property rights, summary evictions, and wills and estates. This jurisdiction generally comprises Titles 1 through 7, 9, 11 through 16, and 41 of NRS and Chapters 1, 2 through 7, 101 through 104A, 111 through 117, 119A, 120, 120A, 453A, 453D, 475, 719, and 721 of NRS, except measures affecting primarily state and local revenues. In addition, the Committee is required to evaluate and review issues relating to juvenile justice.

PAST COMMITTEE ACTION

At the conclusion of the 2023–2024 Interim, the Committee approved 14 recommendations for BDRs to be considered by the Legislature in 2025 and 4 letters. [Bulletin 25-8: Joint Interim Standing Committee on the Judiciary \(2025\)](#) provides a summary of the work of the Committee and is available on the LCB’s website.

Letters approved by the Committee addressed human trafficking and traffic citations:

Human Trafficking

1. Letter to the Governor, Senate Committee on Finance (FIN), and Assembly Committee on Ways and Means (WM) of the 2025 Legislative Session to encourage support for funding data collection via a State Human Trafficking Management Information System.
2. Letter to the Governor, FIN, and WM of the 2025 Legislative Session to encourage support for funding of the receiving centers created in [SB 274](#) (2021) to address critical shelter and housing needs for youth and adults.

Traffic Citations

3. Letter to the Governor, FIN, and WM of the 2025 Legislative Session encouraging the support of additional sources of funding for traffic stop data analysis.
4. Letter to the Director, Department of Public Safety (DPS), requesting the standardized method in [NRS 484B.830](#) be updated to:
 - a. Consistently record arrest data for each traffic stop, including whether an arrest occurred (yes/no) and, if yes, whether it was related or unrelated to the traffic stop;
 - b. Clearly indicate whether a search was conducted (yes/no) for each stop, in addition to existing requirements on the type of search and results;
 - c. Capture whether the stopped driver is likely a Nevada resident, including whether the driver holds a Nevada driver’s license; and
 - d. Clarify and collect data for all traffic stops for which a citation or warning is issued, ensuring both written and verbal warnings are included.

MANDATED ACTIVITIES

In addition to the duties outlined in NRS 218E.330, various statutes and recently enacted legislation require the Committee to review certain topics related to judiciary.

STUDIES

Human Trafficking

The Legislature enacted [Senate Concurrent Resolution 3](#) during the 2025 Regular Legislative Session, directing the JISC on the Judiciary to conduct a study during the 2025–2026 Interim on human trafficking. The Committee must examine Nevada’s legal, systemic, and service frameworks, including laws, programs, data systems, stakeholder coordination, training and reporting, regulatory oversight of service providers, and related policy issues affecting victims and outcomes. The Committee must submit a report of the study and any recommendations for legislation to the Director, LCB, for transmittal to the 84th Session of the Nevada Legislature.

Road Safety

The Legislature enacted [Assembly Concurrent Resolution 4](#) during the 36th Special Session, directing the JISC on the Judiciary to study road safety during the 2025–2026 Interim. The Committee must examine Nevada laws on electric bikes, motorcycles, and scooters; assess and recommend best practices for school zone safety; and consider what authority local governments need to regulate these issues effectively. The Committee must submit a report of the study and any recommendations for legislation to the Director, LCB, for transmittal to the 84th Session of the Nevada Legislature.

REPORTS

In addition to the mandated studies, several bills passed during the 2025 Legislative Session that require various entities to submit new reports to the Committee. The table below lists these newly required reports.

PRIORITY ISSUES OF STUDY

In conjunction with studying the issues outlined above, the Committee will focus its time and attention on issues related to:

- Business law;
- Corrections;
- Domestic violence and sexual assault;
- Family law;
- Juvenile justice;
- Property law; and
- Specialty courts.

The Committee may pursue any other matter in its jurisdiction, as needed, based on current events.

RELEVANT AUDITS AND REPORTS

The Research Division publishes policy papers on current “hot” topics and major policy areas that are available [online](#). Topics covered include Misdemeanors and Gross Misdemeanors under NRS, Penalties for Felonies under NRS, Nevada Violent Crime Rates, and Juvenile Justice in Nevada.

LEGISLATIVE AUDITS

The Legislative Auditor, Audit Division, LCB, performs audits of the Executive and Judicial Branches of the state government. The purpose of the legislative audits is to improve government by providing independent and reliable information to the Legislature about the operation of agencies and programs. The findings of the auditor are published in audit reports, which include constructive suggestions for improvements.

Governmental and Private Facilities for Children

This [report](#) (*Legislative Auditor Report LA26-05, Inspections*, issued on January 16, 2025) includes the results of the inspections of 36 children’s facilities. [Nevada Revised Statutes 218G.570](#) through [218G.595](#) authorize the Legislative Auditor to conduct audits of governmental facilities for children and inspections, reviews, and surveys of governmental and private facilities for children.

REPORTS FROM THE NEVADA JUDICIARY

The Nevada Judiciary publishes an [Annual Report](#) highlighting Nevada's court system, including technological achievements, court improvements, and judicial education. The report also shows statistics and facts about the number and types of cases adjudicated in the courts for the past fiscal year.

STATUTORY REPORTS

The Legislature requires various state and local entities to provide reports to the Legislature, Legislative Commission, Interim Finance Committee, and other legislative committees. A list of various reports related to the criminal justice and the legal system required to be submitted to the Legislature can be found in Appendix B.
