Subject: I recommend an audit of the Nevada Department of Taxation, Compliance Division, Audit Section. Limit the audit scope to the folks who do the sales and use tax audits.

Hello Assemblymembers and Senate Members,

As I mentioned during the Department's budget meetings before the Joint Assembly and Senate Finance Committee, the folks in the audit section who do the sales and use tax audits are doing a very poor job. Poorly done sales and use tax audits not only result in wasted resources within the Audit Section but also in the Revenue Section, Nevada Attorney General's office, Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) office, Nevada Tax Commission, Nevada District Court, and the Nevada Supreme Court. Poorly done audits not only result in a waste of resources but most importantly result in a distrust by the public. I remember a comment that Assemblymember Backus made at the last budget meeting for the Department. She stated, "Audit is needed to educate the public". I totally agree with that comment. Unfortunately, the folks in the audit section are harassing Taxpayers! I have Taxpayers that would like to be here today but the Audit Management at the Department has a policy that if you ask for a refund, you will be audited. They are afraid they will be targeted. We already have Taxpayers that have asked for a refund that are currently being audited or threatened with an audit.

The audit scope needs to include the following:

1. Is the Nevada Taxpayers' Bill of Rights being met when a Taxpayer is selected for audit, when performing the audit, and during the appeal process of the audit?
2. Do they have a system to get feedback from the Taxpayers so they can improve their audits? If so, is it really being used? If not, this needs to be set up ASAP!
3. Security of Taxpayer's financial information by the Audit Management.

Below is my Professional Experience:

DCAA (Defense Contract Audit Agency). I worked as a Contract Auditor at the Northrop Corporation Resident office who oversaw building the B2 Stealth Bomber. This military bomber made the news a few months ago. I know how to do a compliance audit.

Unocal Corporation (now part of Chevron). I worked as an Internal Auditor. My work experience range from auditing a convenience store at truck stops (example the one located outside of Las Vegas), assisting the financial statements year end audit with the outside auditors (Cooper and Lybrand), audit drilling projects that provide natural gas to Thailand, and perform derivative trading in Singapore, or auditing royalties paid to the company by the Trans Alaska Pipeline. I know how to do compliance audits, financial audits, and operation audits.

Wackenhut Services (now part of G4S Secure Solutions USA). I worked as an Audit Manager. I assisted the Inspector General at the United States, Department of Energy in completing the Cooperative Audit Strategy. I completed the annual Allowable Cost audit. I know how to do compliance audits.

Cashman Equipment Company (now part of Empire Caterpillar). I worked as a Financial Accounting Supervisor. My accounting staff published monthly and year-end financial statements. Our work was reviewed by the out-side auditors (Arthur Andersen). Mrs. Mary Kaye Cashman is one of the nicest people you will ever meet.

The Coastal Corporation (now part of Kinder Morgan). I worked as an Internal Auditor. My work experience ranged from auditing convenience stores with gas pumps (example Rebel gas stations in Las Vegas), assisting the financial statements year end audit with the outside auditors (KPMG), auditing projects to build a power plant in India and Pakistan, and major repairs to a refinery in Aubra, and helping the Philippines government set up the free trade zone gas operations at the former United States Navy base at Subic Bay. I know how to do compliance audits, financial audits, and operation audits.

Nevada Department of Taxation. I worked as an Auditor II. I completed Nevada sales and use tax audits.

My reason for leaving the corporate world and joining the Nevada Department of Taxation was due to my wife and I wanting to start a family. I did not want to travel around the world anymore. Yes, I took a major salary cut, but it was by far the best decision I ever made. We had twin girls. One ended up attending and graduating from the University of Houston with a major in Computer Science.
