Dear Chair Dondero Loop and Vice-Chair Monroe-Moreno:

This is the sixth report for regular updates on the progress of the COVID-19 Relief Programs funding by the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF) in response to the letter of intent from the 83rd Session of the Nevada Legislature. The Governor's Finance office continues to work collaboratively with state agencies, organizations, and the Nevada Legislature to ensure the funds are readily available and properly utilized, adhering to all federal guidelines and timelines, and addressing the vital needs of Nevadans.

In response we have prepared the sixth report for review and presentation to the Interim Finance Committee meeting scheduled for April 16, 2026.

A summary detailing each approved allocation of funds obligated to date. The summary should include a description of the project/program, identification of the agency/organization in which the funding was allocated to, a status on the progress of the project/program, and identification of actual spending to date by project/program.

Enclosed with this report is an attachment named "GFO SLFRF Summary 04162026 FINAL". This report provides an updated summary of each allocation as of April 7, 2026.

The identification of any savings resulting from specific project/program allocations.

The savings are shown in Column N of the attached GFO SLFRF Summary 04162026 FINAL.

The identification of any remaining unobligated authority that is available to be allocated for eligible purposes.

The ARPA Team implemented a reoccurring reporting requirement for Subrecipients to provide an updated Spend-Plan and Project Status Report on all active projects due prior to each IFC meeting, beginning November 2025 through December 2026. The Subrecipient data reports collected in March reflect \$126,917.54 of savings identified to be redirected to other projects.

Updates, as applicable, from the U.S. Treasury impacting the administration and deadlines to obligate and expend the funds, or any other matters that may be pertinent to keep the Interim Finance Committee apprised of changes/revisions to the administration, oversight and/or use of ARPA Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Funds.

There are no pertinent updates from the US Treasury that impact the funds currently. The U.S. Government shutdown did not affect the American Rescue Plan Act, State Federal Recovery Funds.
