



IN-STATE TEACHING HIRES


In the last two years, 358* UNR program completers were hired by Nevada school districts:

New Teacher & Admin Preparation

New Preparation Areas

General K-12 Teacher Education

•Plans for **fast track options** to increase teacher output by 10-20%

STEM Education

•NevadaTeach: offers undergraduate students in STEM majors a dual degree in secondary education within four years. Anticipated 50-60 math and science teacher grads per year, quadrupling current output. Spring 2016 enrollment is at 103

Special Education

- •Certified Behavior Analysts in Nevada Schools (CBANS): prepares 21 special ed teachers a year to support students, ages 3-22, with severe behavioral challenges
- •Early Childhood Hybrid Online Special Educator Education (ECHOSEE): goal to graduate 54+ scholars over five years with emphasis in early intervention/early childhood special education to serve children birth through age 7 with disabilities and their families
- •Project in the works: "Preparing Qualified Teachers of Students with Significant Intellectual Disabilities"



New Teacher & Admin Preparation

New Preparation Areas

English Language Learners

- •Northern Nevada English Learning Initiative (NNELI): 45 graduates so far provided with ESL training to procure an ESL/ELAD endorsement, especially for working within STEM
- •Online ELAD endorsement course now ready
- •White House Initiative: Commitment to Action to attract more ethnic diversity

Early Childhood Education

•Plans for **fast track option** to increase K-3 teacher output by 30 per year in the near future

NevadaLeads

•Plans for WCSD collaborative principal training program that emphasizes mentorship, 21st century leadership skill development, and embedded field experiences. Anticipated to launch spring 2017

Important updates from the University of Nevada, Reno College of Education regarding teacher education, retention, accountability, and quality. As of February 2016.

Early Childhood Fast Track to Teaching

Neurala has a shortage of teachers with expertise to the Birth to 2nd Grade Roensure area. This program will increase the number of highly-qualified early childhood teachers available for hire.

- Fast track to ECE teacher licensure for students who have graduated with a B.S. in Human Development & Family Studies
 One-year post-bacoduareate program with goal of enrolling 20 students in initial cohort beginning Full '16, and 30 students
- per year thereafter

Collaboration through CUSP

The Community University School Partnership (CUSP) represents a collaborative relationship among UNR, WCSD, and the regional community with multiple great funded and professional development programs that support shaden learning based on the Nevada Academic Content Standards. Intilatives for At-Risk Youth

- Deart Future Scholars is an academic outreach program simed at increasing the number of low-income, first-generation
- students gaining access to higher education by providing financial aid, mentorable, and career opportunities. It will expand recruitment by at least 10% in 2016.


- The Intergenenational Mentioring Program to Attract and Betale

NevadaTeach

NevadaTeach will increase the number of secondary STEM teacher and is UNN's implementation of the national UTeach program, which has a national network of 44 universities.

Principal Leadership Collaborative

UNR and WCSD are designing a collaborative program that will provide more high-quality school principals to WCSD.

- Specialized program to mentor and train current WCSD teachers to become well-prepared, qualified principals with 21st century skills and competencies
- Goal for first cohort to begin in Spring '17 with 20-25 participants

The NV School Transformation Project

The Nevada School Transformation Project introduces school-wide Fostitive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS), a multitiened behavior framework for improving student academic and behavior outcomes, to Nevada schools.

- The Nevada Center for Excellence in Disabilities kicked off this project in Fall '15 with 10 pilot schools
- Seven school districts are signed up, with state-wide participation to increase over the next few years

Quality Performance

Data reveals that first-year teachers who graduated from UNK autperform other program graduates.

- In first-year WCSD teacher evaluations conducted by HEI, UNR graduates outperformed others on all four categories (planning and preparation, classroom environment, instruction, and professional responsibilities) and on 22 of 24 standards
- Eighty-five percent of the 45 principals who responded to a survey asking for their perception of the quality of the UNR teacher education program indicated they agreed or strongly agreed with all 21 questions, with highest levels of agreement on the program preparing teachers to "develop lesson plans," "use a variety of teaching methods appropriate to the students and use level," and more
