
It is the mission of the Nevada Department of Corrections to protect the public by confining convicted felons according to the law, while keeping staff and inmates safe.

(November 2013 – April 2014)

- Assess existing staffing pattern for each facility
- Review prison-specific services, mandates, staff charts and schedules, inmate activity schedules, inmate demographics, incident reports, grievances, unit floor plans, and other data.
- Provide a prioritized set of posts within each institution
- Provide a realistic set of staffing plans & updated relief factors
