

# Safe Schools Healthy Students Grant

## Safe Schools/Healthy Students Grant Facts:

- The grant was established in 1999
- This is the first year states have been given this award
- The hope is to push policy/procedure statewide for programs that are successful during the grant period
- Four year grant
- First year is strictly planning
- Funding:
  - Year 1: \$2,035,011
  - Years 2-4: \$2,214,000 per year

## Goals and Objectives:

- The creation of safe and violence free schools
- The promotion of mental, emotional, and behavioral health of children and youth
- The promotion of early childhood social and emotional learning programs
- The connection of families, schools and communities
- The prevention and reduction of alcohol, tobacco, and other drug use

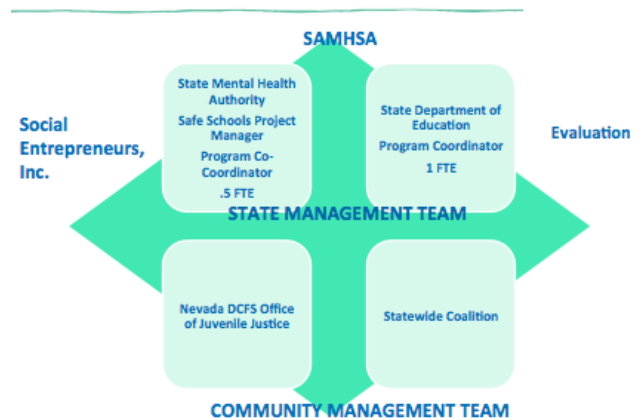
## Timeline:

- When funding arrives, a Needs Assessment, Environmental Scan and Gaps analysis will begin (about 5 months to complete)
- The evaluator (state currently has RFP out for the evaluator) will use the information discovered to begin the framework for a comprehensive plan (completed early fall)
- Year two implementation of evidenced based programs will begin (after the Needs Assessment, Environmental Scan, and Gaps Analysis is complete)

## Partners:

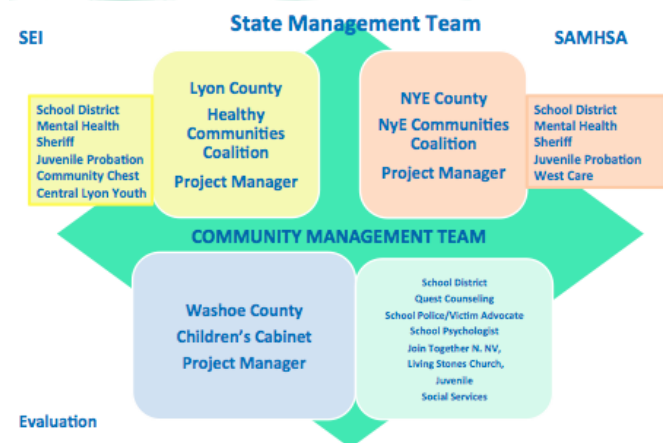
- Subgrantees consist of two coalitions and one non-profit agency: NyE Communities Coalition, Healthy Communities Coalition, and Children's Cabinet
