Residents

- medical school graduates
- physicians
- completing their specialty-specific training
- Hands-on education required for independent licensure by states
- varies from 3 7 years
- residents provide direct patient care
- median 1st year salary of \$49,651 (direct costs of training and support \$110K)

Residents

- Care for the underserved
- Teaching hospitals more likely to do community outreach
- Provide complex & acute care
- GME programs are the pipeline for patient access to healthcare
- Training residents is beneficial for communities



The physician workforce issue is entirely a GME matter (quality & quantity)



Nevada

- Low ratio of physicians to population
- Among the lowest ratios of Residents to population
- Insufficient numbers of specialty & subspecialty providers
- Fastest way to add physicians is to import them; difficult and expensive, and hasn't worked in NV
- Doctors practice where they complete their GME training (<u>not</u> necessarily where they went to medical school) "<u>Train & Retain</u>"

GME programs do even more:

- Attract physicians
 According to Merritt Hawkins, an Irving, Texas-based physician recruiting firm: "Nevada suffers from a chronic physician shortage partly due to a lack of residency and training programs."
- Improve quality of care
- Generate clinical, basic science, and translational research


