Psychiatry is a Medical Specialty

- 4 Years of Medical School to MD or DO
- 4 years of Residency which includes a minimum of 4 months of Primary Care Medicine and 2 months of Neurology
- Psychiatric Rotations on Inpatient Units, Outpatient Clinics and Consultation Services
- The Fourth Year of Residency can be the First Year of a 2 Year Child Psychiatry Fellowship
- Become Board Eligible at the end of 4 years

Psychiatrists are Trained to:

- Do complete psychiatric evaluations
- Do a differential diagnosis which considers all possible medical conditions
- Do a mental status exam which includes a cognitive assessment
- Do a differential diagnosis considering all mental illnesses in DSM 5
- Prescribe medications
- Appreciate side effects, drug-drug interactions and metabolic efficiency of the patient

Psychiatrists also are trained:

- To be the team leader
- To consult to medical colleagues
- To interact with the legal and court system
- To do various forms of psychotherapy
- To collaborate with other providers of mental health care

Psychiatrists in Nevada

- There are 424 psychiatrists licensed in Nevada
 - 371 are MD, 53 are DO
 - 157 live out of state and 268 are in state
 - Seven in state are Inactive status
 - 91 are in the North and 177 are in the South
 - 18 in the North are residents, 25 in the South are residents
 - 12 VA psychiatrists have out of state licenses

Child Psychiatrists

- 48 Psychiatrists identify themselves as Child Psychiatrists
 - 24 in the South and 24 in the North
 - 20 in the South and 17 in the North are ABPN Board Certified in Child Psychiatry
 - Both Reno and Las Vegas Residencies now have Child Psychiatry Fellowships with 4 slots (2 a year) each

Psychiatry Residents

- Both Reno and Las Vegas campuses of UNSOM have Psychiatry Residencies
- Reno starts 4 new residents a year and Las Vegas now starts
 6 a year
- Both programs plan to increase with new funds recommended by the GME Task Force and appropriated in the 2015 session
- 16 of the 32 graduated Las Vegas residents have remained in Las Vegas
- 33 of the graduated Reno residents have remained in Nevada including 27 of 46 from 2004 to 2016
- 35 UNSOM or Touro medical student graduates have remained or returned to Nevada after psychiatry residency
