Comparison Metrics

- 35% increase in degrees and certificates awarded over five years. Average three-year graduation rate is 22%.
 - AA/AS students graduate at highest rates 26% and 27%, respectively
- Capture rate of service area high school graduates has recently declined while market share for two school districts has increased.
- Service area unemployment rates continue to be higher than the national average.
- Large proportion of 1st generation college attendees

Budget Overview

- Overall budget is projected to decrease by over 25% in FY 16 as compared to FY 08 (full impact of new formula)
- Currently impact of formula funding mitigated by one-time funds from State and NSHE
- Planning is starting now for next biennium
 - College-wide ad hoc formula funding committee
- Impact of reduction will be softened by ability to roll tuition and fee revenue forward one year

Jump Start College

- Partnership between service area school districts and Western Nevada College.
- Designed to offer high-achieving high school students an opportunity to earn up to 12 college credits prior to high school graduation.
- Initial roll-out fall 2014
- Testing is underway for initial group



Western Nevada College Latino Cohort Program


Goal: Enable first-generation Latino students to meet or exceed the persistence and graduation rate for the college as a whole.

Elements of the program:

- Family-based cohort model
- Cohort established directly out of high school and coached through college completion and transfer
- Cultural barriers to success are addressed throughout the process

Western Nevada College Anticipated Academic Outcomes

- Increase college going-rates and success among area high school students
- Increase retention and graduation rates of all new, full-time, degree-seeking students
- Shorten time-to-degree for full-time students
- Retain and graduate Latino students and veterans at the same or higher rates as the general student population and within the same time frame
