- Referrals from School Districts for Minor Offenses
 - > Truancy
 - Simple School Disturbances
 - > Zero Tolerance

- Provide Mental Health Services to Kids

Reexamine

- > **SB 112** (2011 Session)
 - ➤ Revises provisions relating to the records that may be reviewed by a juvenile court in certain proceedings.
- > **SB 26** (2011 Session)
 - > Revises various provisions relating to judicial administration.
- > **SB 86** (2009 Session)
 - Makes various changes concerning children who are ordered to be placed in the custody of certain governmental entities by the juvenile court.

Identified Statute Changes

- > NRS 62E.710 Violation of Probation or Parole
 - Allow only children convicted of felony or gross misdemeanor to be placed in facility for detention
 - > Would not allow children charged with misdemeanors to be sent to state commitment for probation or parole violation
- > NRS 62E.520 A child that is at least 8 years of age but less than 12 years of age, may be placed in correctional or institutional facility
 - Increase the age a child may be placed in correctional facility
- NRS 62B.390 Certification of Child for Criminal Proceedings as Adult
 - Increase the age a child may be certified
- NRS 62B.330, 62E.100, 62E.280, 62E.290 Juvenile Competency
