Authority & Codes

- Douglas County Solid Waste Management Plan was prepared pursuant to Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) 444.658
 - Updated 2008
- Nevada Revised Statues (NRS) 244.187, 244.188 & 244.320
 - Allows County to enter into Franchise Agreements for Solid Waste Management Activities
 - Public Health and Safety

Authority & Codes

- Douglas County Code (DDC)
 - DDC Title 18 Town Annexation & Service Districts
 - DDC 18.04 Town Minden
 - Grants authority to the Town to perform garbage and trash collection
 - Mandatory pickup service
 - DDC 18.06 Town of Gardnerville
 - Grants authority to the Town to perform garbage and trash collection
 - Mandatory pickup service

Authority & Codes

- Douglas County Code (DDC)
 - DDC Title 19 Initiative Ordinances
 - DDC 19.04
 - Requires 2/3 vote of residents before mandatory garbage pickup becomes law
 - All Solid Waste Transfer Stations in Douglas County must be owned by Douglas County
 - All monies collected for solid waste management activitives shall remain in the Solid Waste Management Fund and be used to address state and federal mandates
 - Rate/fee increases of 10% or greater require voter approval

Tahoe Basin

- South Lake Tahoe Basin Waste Management Authority
 - Created in 1994
 - Joint Powers Authority (JPA)
 - City of South Lake Tahoe
 - Eldorado County
 - Douglas County
 - Regulate and manage all solid waste activities
 - Broad Powers

Tahoe Basin

- Franchise Agreement(s) with South Tahoe Refuse (STR)
 - 2012 Douglas County amended its franchise agreement to adopt a new rate setting manual
 - Collaborative Effort
 - Establish consistent and uniform rate setting schedules and procedures for all three entities
 - Rates are reviewed by the JPA and established by Resolution approved by the Board of County Commissioners
 - Reviewed/adjusted annually

Carson Valley

- Franchise Agreement Douglas Disposal, Inc. (DDI)
 - Provides solid waste management activities within the County
 - Exceptions
 - Lake Tahoe Township
 - Towns of Minden and Gardnerville
 - Trash pick-up is not mandated

Carson Valley

- Transfer Station
 - 1995
 - Leased and operated by DDI
- Rate Setting Committee
 - Consisted of appointed community members
 - Adopted rate setting manual
 - Rates are established by Resolution adopted the Board of County Commissioners
 - Reviewed/adjusted annually

Carson Valley

- Solid Waste Diversion to Carson City
 - Materials Recovery Facility vs. Lockwood Landfill
- Results of Analysis
 - Higher tipping fees vs. reduced hauling costs
- Summary of Findings
 - Rate increase to Douglas County customers
