Alan Rosenthal Biography

Alan Rosenthal is a professor of public policy and political science at Rutgers University's Eagleton Institute of Politics, where he served as director from 1974 to 1994. Rosenthal has conducted studies of and consulted with legislatures in many of the states and has collaborated on activities with the Council of State Governments, the National Conference of State Legislatures, and the State Legislative Leaders Foundation. In 2006 he was given an award for lifetime achievement from NCSL and SLLF. Earlier, in 1995, he received an award from the American Political Science Association as a person whose published work and career represent a significant contribution to the art of government through the application of social science research. In New Jersey, his public service to the state has included chairing the Legislature's Commission on Legislative Ethics and Campaign Finance, chairing the Joint Legislative Committee on Ethical Standards, chairing the state's Congressional Redistricting Commission in 1992 and 2002, and serving as the tie-breaker member of the Legislative Reapportionment Commission in 2011. He has written books and articles on state legislatures, state politics, and policymaking. His most recent books are Engines of Democracy: Politics and Policy Making in State Legislatures (CQ Press, 2009) and The Best Job in Politics: Exploring How Governors Succeed as Policy Leaders (CQ Press, 2012).
