

How to Obtain a Driver's License or ID Card

For those with an NDOC Inmate Card



Legislative History

- SB 423 introduced in 2013 Legislative Session
 - Authorized the Nevada Department of Corrections to create an ID card for a person being released from one of their facilities
 - Then required the DMV to accept this NDOC ID card as acceptable proof of identity
- Passed into law on May 30, 2013
- Effective January 1, 2014

Using the NDOC ID as Proof of Identity

- From NAC 483.050:
 - *“An applicant for a driver’s license or identification card may, pursuant to NRS 483.290 or 483.860, furnish a photo identification card issued by the Department of Corrections as proof of his or her full legal name and age if the applicant also presents to the Department of Motor Vehicles the documentation that the Department of Corrections used to prove the applicant’s name and age for the purpose of issuing the photo identification card.”*

Current Process

NDOC

- At time of release, inmate is issued an NDOC ID Card
- Further provides assistance *as requested* by inmate to help obtain birth certificate or other relevant documents
- Release packet to include inmate's social security card and birth certificate

DMV

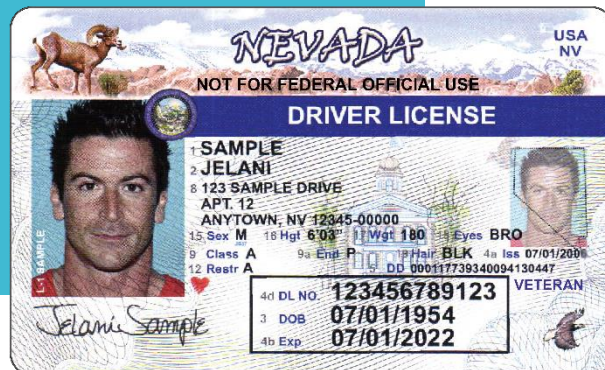
- Must bring acceptable documents to be issued a DL or ID card.
- If within 90 days after release from NDOC facility, fees are waived for obtaining a duplicate DL or ID card.

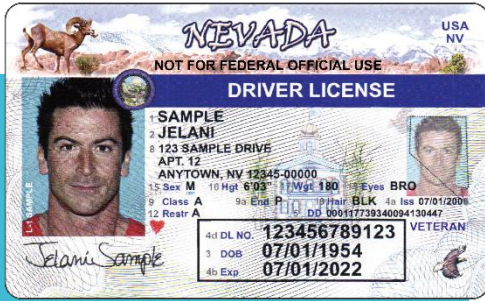
Former Inmate

- Able to regain driving privileges or use DL/ID card to gain employment or for other purposes

How to Obtain a Duplicate Copy of a Driver's License or ID Card

- If the individual is eligible for a duplicate, they may obtain one with the following:
 - *DMV-002 App for Driving Privilege or ID Card*
 - Any applicable fees or *Request for Waiving Duplicate Fees for Released Prisoners* form if within 90 days
 - *Certificate of Released Prisoner* form issued by the NDOC (in order to waive the fees)

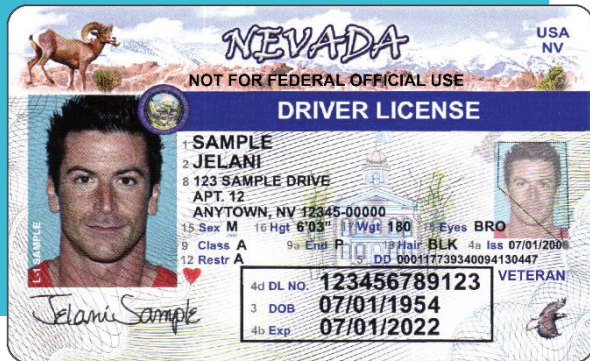




How to Obtain an Original Driver's License or ID Card

- In order to obtain an original Nevada standard ID or non-commercial driver's license, an applicant needs to visit an office location and provide the following:
 - *DMV-002 App for Driving Privilege or ID Card*
 - Identification Card issued by NDOC (If you do not have this card, you will need to present identity documents.)
 - Social Security Document, if applicable.
 - Immigration documents, if applicable
 - 2 proofs of your Nevada residential address
 - Any applicable fees
- The NDOC ID is NOT acceptable proof of identity to obtain a Real ID.

How to Renew a Driver's License or ID Card



- In order to renew a Nevada standard ID or non-commercial driver's license, an applicant needs provide the following:
 - *DMV-002 App for Driving Privilege or ID Card*
 - Previously issued driver's license, identification card or NDOC ID card
 - If you do not have the items listed above, the DMV will attempt to determine your identity based on personal information on file, a previous photo and signature
 - Immigration documents, if applicable, are also required at time of renewal
 - If you are renewing a driver authorization card you will also need to present 2 proofs of your Nevada residential address
 - Any applicable fees
- The NDOC ID is NOT acceptable proof of identity to upgrade to a Real ID.

Released Prisoner Driver's License and Identification Card Information Sheet

Duplicate

If you were released from prison within the immediate preceding 90 days and you have an active Nevada non-commercial driver's license or identification card you may obtain a duplicate card at no cost. You will need to present the following:

1. *DMV-002 App for Driving Privilege or ID Card.*
2. *DP-190 Request for Waiving Duplicate Fees (this is a one-time waiver of fees. Reimbursement will be collected at time of renewal).*
3. *Certificate of Released Prisoner* from the Nevada Department of Corrections (NDOC). (An equivalent document from an out-of-state institution may also be accepted with a DMV supervisor approval).

Renewal

If you were recently released from prison and you would like to renew your Nevada, non-commercial driver's license or identification card, you will need to present the following:

1. *DMV-002 App for Driving Privilege or ID Card.*
2. Previously issued driver's license, identification card or a *Certificate of Released Prisoner* from NDOC, if available.
3. If you do not have the items listed above the DMV will attempt to determine your identity based on personal information on file, a previous photo and signature.
4. Immigration documents, if applicable are also required at time of renewal.
5. If you are renewing a driver authorization card you will also need to present 2 proofs of your Nevada residential address.
6. Applicable fees.

Original

If you were recently released from prison and you would like to obtain a Nevada, non-commercial driver's license, identification card or a driver authorization card you will need to present the following:

1. *DMV-002 App for Driving Privilege or ID Card*
2. *Identification Card* issued by NDOC. (If you were not issued an ID card you will need to present identity documents).
3. Social Security document, if applicable.
4. Immigration documents, if applicable.
5. 2 proofs of your Nevada residential address.
6. Applicable fees.

What Documents?

- For proof of name and DOB, bring one of the following documents. It MUST be an original or certified copy:
 - United States Birth Certificate
- For proof of Nevada Residency:
 - U.S. Passport (with Nevada address)
 - DMV 005 Certification of Residency
 - DMV 115 Relief Agency and Shelter Certification
- For proof of Social Security Number:
 - Other standard proof of residency documents, if available
 - Social Security Card (Original—not a copy)
 - W-2 (must contain full SSN)
 - Paystub (must contain full SSN)
 - IRS Form 1099 (must contain full SSN)

The second resident does not need to accompany the applicant to the DMV.

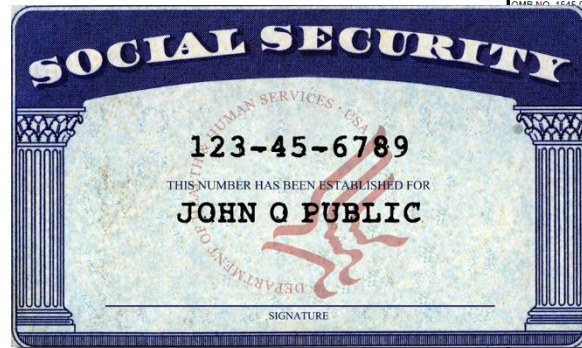

High-Level Summary

- Overall, the process is not that much different than it is for non-offenders to obtain identification
- Federal Real ID requirements restrict ALL citizens to using only very specific documents—not exclusively an obstacle for former offenders

Current Obstacles

- Inmates sometimes have multiple identities and don't want their true identity known for various reasons
- Argument that you cannot obtain an ID without a birth certificate, and you cannot obtain a birth certificate without an ID
- Must be a certain level of validation required, otherwise compromising identity verification process

How to Obtain a Birth Certificate



- Confirmed the following Nevada offices of vital records DO accept the NDOC issued-ID card or Probation Documents as an acceptable form of identification in order to request a duplicate birth certificate:
 - Southern Nevada Health District (Clark County Birth Records after 1973)
 - Nevada Division of Public & Behavioral Health-Office of Vital Records
 - Washoe County Health District-Office of Vital Statistics

DMV Responsibility

- Historically, the DMV's purpose was to provide a driver's license that proves one has both the knowledge and the skills to operate a vehicle
- The reality is that now, the DMV serves as keepers and provers of identification.

Moving Forward...

- Understand the importance of this process and the transparency behind it
- Other county and municipal juvenile and adult detention agencies are proposing legislation to enact similar ID cards for their released individuals
- Look forward to working together to improve the process for all parties involved
