Board of Parole Commissioners <u>Agency goals:</u>

 Conducting and completing prompt, fair and impartial hearings on parole release and parole violation matters.

 Maintaining the safety of the general public is the top priority in the decision making process.



Board of Parole Commissioners Enhancements:

- Addition of an Administrative Assistant III to support the Program Officer I with Pardons Board duties.

- Transition of the Parole Board's current phone system to the State's phone system.

Board of Parole Commissioners <u>Areas of Importance/Concern:</u>

Cat 12 - Hearing Representatives

- Hearing Representatives decreased from FY16 Base (\$58,370) to FY17 Work Program (\$43,723) to meet the cap.
- Consequences of insufficient Hearing Representative funding include an increased case load for Commissioners, which can further result in a higher denial rate.



Board of Parole Commissioners <u>Areas of Importance/Concern (cont.):</u>

- The Board was not funded to replace the parole hearings module in NDOC's NOTIS system (NDOC is moving away from using NOTIS).
- The Parole Hearing Module provides for organizational processes and functionality. Without this module, more personnel are needed to manage processes.
- Additionally, the NOTIS database stores information that is critical to ensuring the risk instrument used by the board remains valid. A solution to ensure no loss in functionality needs to be addressed before the Board is forced to move to a manual system of managing its processes.
