



Housing Division Budget Highlights

Merger of Manufactured Housing and Housing Divisions (BDR 17A7441484)

Leverage inspection, compliance, and consumer service efficiencies by pooling staffing resources for affordable housing issues.

Combines compliance and inspection personnel for both Manufactured Housing and Housing to realize organizational efficiencies.

Low Income Housing Grants

National Housing Trust Fund and the federal Section 811 Grants, \$3.4 million/year

Governor's Office of Energy Funding

Continuation of partnership with Governor's Office of Energy to provide ongoing energy efficiency assistance to seniors and state employees, \$1.5 million/year

Manufactured Housing Division

The Manufactured Housing Division inspects manufactured structures to ensure they are constructed, installed and repaired in a manner according to statute, regulates licenses issued by the division for sales, repair and modification of manufactured structures to protect the consumer.



Real Estate Division

The Real Estate Division has seen a dramatic increase in Licensees, Permits issued and new Home Owner Association's and units. The housing rebound has caused a tremendous acceleration in the demand for administrative support and enforcement in the areas of licensing, regulation, education and discipline. The Division is also looking to the future and developing strategies to provide more services and resources online.





Real Estate Division Staffing

STAFFING LEVELS:

Real Estate licensees section is funded by an appropriation through the General Fund. This section in 2008/09 had 29 FTE's and with the subsequent General Fund reductions the staffing was cut down to 17.2 FTE's Resulting in a 41% decrease in personnel.



Real Estate Division Staffing

Subsequently due to the efforts of the Director's office and temporary funding from the AG's office 5.4 FTE's were funded. The funding for these positions is slated to end in 2016. This would result in a 31% overall reduction in staff levels from 2008 even as our licenses and permits have grown well over pre-recession highs.





Real Estate Division Budget Highlights

Continuing the Real Estate Consumer Assistance Positions

Continued funding support for 5.4 positions to assist consumers with real estate related compliance and enforcement matters, funded by General Fund appropriations instead of Mortgage Settlement monies.

Mortgage Lending Division

The Mortgage Lending Division promotes and regulates non-depository mortgage lending and related business, protecting the public from predatory lenders and mortgage servicers. The state's mortgage industry has rebounded robustly since the financial crisis, and the Division is now in a stable financial position.

2015 Legislative Assembly Bill 480 initiated the implementation of the Loan Servicing Program

- ➤ Phase one: FY17 Two Mortgage Lending Examiners were added
- ➤ Phase two: FY18 Request for One Mortgage Lending Examiner

Nevada Transportation Authority

The Nevada Transportation Authority (NTA) regulates the transportation (buses, limos, movers) and the taxi industries in all Nevada Counties except Clark County. The Division performs vehicle safety inspections, completes background investigations, and licensed drivers. The NTA has successfully implemented the regulation of Transportation Network Companies (TNC) and their 42,000 drivers.

Taxicab Authority

The Taxicab Authority regulates the taxicab industry in Clark County. The Division licenses taxicab drivers, performs vehicle safety inspections, ensures compliance and enforcement of regulations within the industry.

The agency reserves are diminishing as a result of TNC competition and declining rides in the industry. Calendar year 2016 revenue was 15% lower than the prior twelve months.

Nevada Athletic Commission

- Commission Goal: Protect the health and safety of the fighters and provide a level playing field for all participants
- The Nevada Athletic Commission is a recognized leader in regulating unarmed combat sports
- Hosting world premier boxing and MMA events bring world-wide recognition and tourism to Nevada





Athletic Commission Budget Highlights

Implement Competition Testing

Includes funding of \$309,600 per fiscal year to implement a program for in- and out-of competition drug testing, as well as research, seminars, training and travel.

Automate the Administration Systems (Only B&I TIR)

The budget includes funding of \$149,517 to automate the agency's manual administration systems.

Division of Industrial Relations

The Industrial Relations Division administers the Nevada Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), Safety Consultation and Training, Mine Safety and Training, as well as Workers Compensation.

- Providing access to the 81,500 Employers Statewide and the 1.1 million employees that make up our workforce
- Mining Safety Unit assists 2,051 mine operators by providing training for 31,000 mining related employees
- ➤ BDR 53-160 to update standards for workplace injuries and fatalities



Division of Insurance

The Division of Insurance is responsible under Title 57 of the NRS for the regulation of the industry. The Division regulates and licenses insurance providers and other professionals; sets ethical and financial standards for insurance companies; and reviews rates. The Division also reviews programs operated by self-insured employers for workers compensation

Labor Commissioner

It is the mission of the Labor Commissioner's office to resolve labor-related problems in an efficient, professional, and effective manner and to take enforcement action when necessary to ensure that Nevada's workers are treated fairly and compensated for all time worked.

This includes educating employers and employees regarding their rights under the law in an effort to promote the growth of business in Nevada.

The Financial Institutions Division maintains a system that is safe and sound, protects consumers, defends the overall public interest, and promotes economic development through the efficient, effective, and equitable licensing, examination, and supervision of depository, fiduciary, and non-depository financial institutions.

Nevada Attorney for Injured Workers

The Nevada Attorney for Injured Workers (NAIW) represents injured workers at the appeals level of the administrative hearing process.

NAIW's BASE budget will deliver to our clients and the public the level of service necessary to meet our core objectives. All enhancements to that base are for replacement of obsolete IT equipment so that level of service can be maintained into the future.

Employee Management Relations Board

The Employee Management Relations Board (EMRB) works with local government and public employee unions coordinating and developing trained employee groups through the collective bargaining process. EMRB provides a venue for dispute resolution.

- The EMRB is self-funded and has no budget enhancement requests
- The agency continues to operate with two employees as it has for more than four decades
- Public sector labor relations appear calm throughout the state with the number of complaints trending downward
