**ASSEMBLY BILL 112 (First Reprint)**

**Revises provisions governing the policy concerning a safe and respectful learning environment for children enrolled in public schools throughout the State. (BDR No. 34-220)**

Assembly Bill 112 expands the Legislature's goal to provide a safe and respectful learning environment by ensuring the quality of instruction is not negatively impacted by poor attitudes or interactions among school district personnel. The policy established by the Department of Education must include requirements and methods for reporting violations among or between teachers and other educational personnel. The bill also requires the policy promote a positive learning environment.

**Amendments:** Working with the sponsor, Chair Harris has proposed a conceptual amendment to ensure that terminology referring to personnel other than administrators, principals, and teachers are consistent within the bill and with current statute.

**Special Note:** There was no testimony in opposition. There is no fiscal note for this bill.
