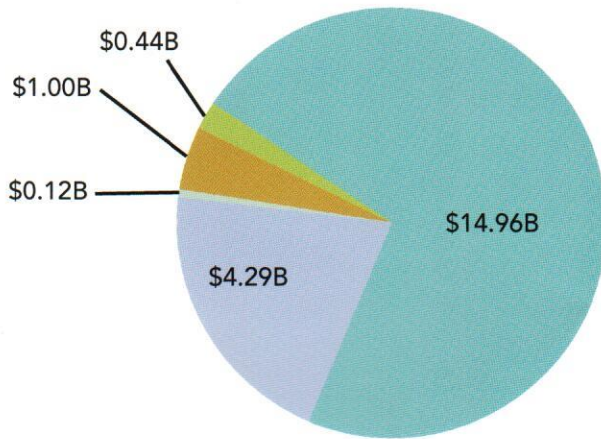
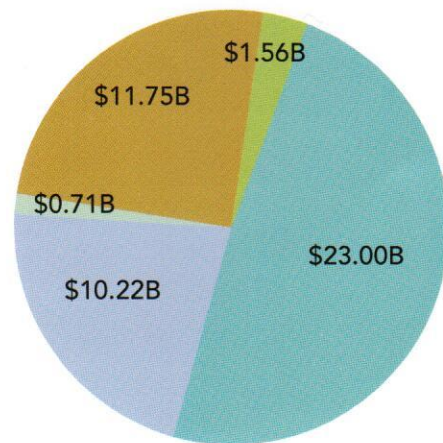

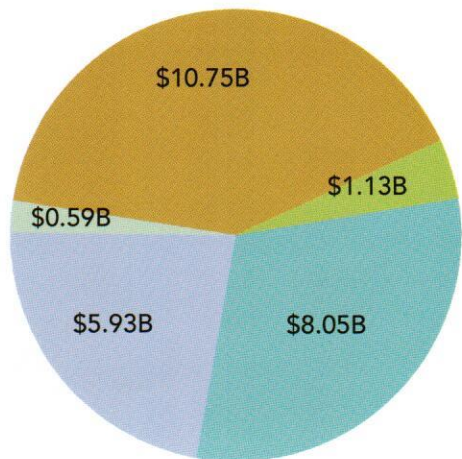
Current Revenue through 2035
