**SENATE BILL 360 (R1)**

**Provides for an interim study concerning energy efficiency programs and the financing of clean energy in this State. (BDR S-41)**

**Sponsored by:** Senators Spearman, Ford, Woodhouse, Kihuen, Parks, et al.  
**Date Heard:** May 27, 2015  
**Fiscal Impact:** Effect on Local Government: No.  
Effect on the State: Yes.

Senate Bill 360 directs the Legislative Committee on Energy to conduct a study in the 2015-2016 Interim concerning energy efficiency programs and the viability of establishing green banks and similar entities to assist in the financing of clean energy programs.

The Committee shall consult with the Public Utilities Commission of Nevada, the Office of Energy, the Office of the State Treasurer, and other entities with knowledge of matters relevant to energy efficiency programs. Senate Bill 360 sets out a list of issues the Committee shall study. The Committee shall submit its report and any recommendations to the 79th Session of the Legislature and others.

**Amendments:** No amendments have been offered.
