Sec 7(3)(b)	Re: assistance filling out a ballot on behalf of a voter: Submit a written statement with the mail ballot that includes the name, address, and signature of the person	Remove this subsection. The person providing assistance must indicate on the ballot return envelope that assistance was provided by printing their name, address, and signature

Sec 11(4)(b)(1)	Substitution of initials for first or middle name of a voter or use of a common nickname	<p>Add:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Allow for differences in punctuation of a person's name in a signature ● Allow for use of one last name for a person who has two last names <p>So long as the signature does not differ in multiple, significant, and obvious respects from the signatures of the voter available in the records of the county clerk</p>
Sec 11(7)(b)	Requires clerks to prescribe procedures to contact a voter who failed to sign their ballot return envelope	<p>Align signature verification requirements from NRS 293.285 to apply to mail in ballots as well:</p> <p>If the signature does not match, the voter must be identified by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Answering questions from the election board officer covering the personal data which is reported on the application to register to vote; ● Providing the election board officer with personal data which verifies the identity of the voter; or, ● Providing the election board officer with proof of identification as described in NRS 293.277 other than the voter registration card issues to the voter

Sec 13(2)	Re: two ballots returned in a single envelope: if a majority of the inspectors are of the opinion that the mail ballots folded together were voted by one person, the mail ballots must be rejected...	If two mail ballots are returned in the same envelope, they must be rejected
Sec 14(2)	... the numbers on the mail ballot and return envelope compared, the number strip of stub detached from the mail ballot and, if the numbers are the same....	Remove section 14(2) as voters are instructed to remove the stub when they return their ballot. There are no numbers on the ballot to match back to the envelope as that would violate the secrecy of a voter's ballot.
Sec 14(3)	Election board officers indicate in the roster "voted" by the name of the voter	During signature verification, the ballot is not opened. Placing "voted" on the roster

<p>Sec 27(4) and corresponding sections</p>	<p>Re: a voter who appears to vote in person whose signature differs from that on file-- For the purposes of subsection 2, the personal data of a voter does not include his or her date of birth</p>	<p>Clarify that date of birth can be a piece of information used to verify a voter’s identity if the voter appears at the polls in person and their signature doesn’t match the one on file.</p>
