ASSEMBLY BILL 186 (R1)

Establishes provisions relating to the issuance of citations and arrests by peace officers. (BDR 23-634)

Sponsored By: Assembly Members Nguyen, Roberts, Watts, Miller, and Peters, et al.

Assembly Bill 186 prohibits a law enforcement agency from requiring a peace officer to issue a certain number of traffic citations or to make a certain number of arrests. Additionally, the bill prohibits a law enforcement agency from considering the number of citations or arrests, or the amount of fines or fees assessed from the citations or arrests made by a peace officer, in evaluating the performance of the peace officer.

Amendments: At the hearing, Assemblywoman Nguyen proposed the attached conceptual amendment. The amendment:

- Adds Assembly Members Matthews, Anderson, Brown-May, Considine, Dickman, Duran, Martinez, Thomas, and Torres as sponsors; and
- Deletes subsection 2 of Section 1 of the bill, thereby deleting the portion of the bill prohibiting a law enforcement agency from considering the number of citations or arrests, or the amount of fines or fees assessed from the citations or arrests made by a peace officer, in evaluating the performance of the peace officer.
