ASSEMBLY BILL 178

Revises provisions governing emergency medical services. (BDR 40-730)

Sponsored By: Assembly Members Gurr and Gray, et al.
Date Heard: March 10, 2023
Fiscal Notes: Effect on Local Government: May have Fiscal Impact.
Effect on the State: Yes.

Assembly Bill 178 extends from 1 year to 5 years the length of a permit issued by a health authority for the operation of an ambulance, air ambulance, or fire-fighting vehicle. Any permit issued on or before October 1, 2023, expires on July 1, 2024, and any renewal of such a permit expires 5 years following the date of renewal.

Finally, the bill requires operators to notify the permitting health authority about any change in ownership or control within 90 days after the change occurs.

Amendments:

Tom Clark, Owner, Tom Clark Solutions, proposes to amend the AB 178 with the intent to reduce from five to two years the length of a permit issued or renewed by a health authority for an ambulance, air ambulance, or fire-fighting vehicle (see also attached).

Proposed Revised Amendment to Assembly Bill 178

EXPLANATION: Matter in (1) *blue bold italics* is new language in the original bill; (2) variations of **green bold underlining** is language proposed to be added in this amendment; (3) ~~red strikethrough~~ is deleted language in the original bill; (4) ~~purple double strikethrough~~ is language proposed to be deleted in this amendment; (5) orange double underlining is deleted language in the original bill proposed to be retained in this amendment.

The purpose of this amendment is to reduce the number of years that AB178 proposes for an ambulance, air ambulance or fire-fighting vehicle is permitted from 5 years to 2 years.

6. All permits expire ~~on July 1~~ 2 ~~5~~ years following the date of issue, and are renewable ~~annually~~ *each second fifth year* thereafter upon payment of the fee required by subsection 5 at least 30 days before the expiration date.

Sec. 2. 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of NRS 450B.200, as amended by section 1 of this act, any valid permit that is issued on or before October 1, 2023, pursuant to the provisions of NRS 450B.200, as that section existed on September 30, 2023, expires on July 1, 2024. Any renewal of such a permit expires ~~5~~ 2 years following the date of renewal.
