Senate Bill 294 Conceptual Amendment:

Section 3: strike section 3 of the bill, retaining original NRS language and definition of locking device

Section 6:

- **Subsection 3:** Add the language back into the bill.
 - The firearm was stored in a securely locked container or at a location which a reasonable person would have believed to be secure.
- **Subsection 5:** Add the language back into the bill.
 - Unless a greater penalty is provided by law, a person is guilty of a misdemeanor who:
 - Negligently stores or leaves a firearm at a location under his or her control; and
 - Knows or has reason to know that there is a substantial risk that a child prohibited from handling or having in his or her possession or under his or her control any firearm pursuant to this section may obtain such a firearm.

Section 8

- **Subsection 4(6)(h):** strike “active shooter preparedness and”
- **Subsection 3, New Paragraph:**
 - The board of trustees of each school district and the governing body of each charter school shall:
 - I. Require school police departments under their jurisdiction to provide training for their officers to perform active assailant movement techniques as a standard firearms proficiency test or require school police departments under their jurisdiction to participate in joint exercises and collaborate with other law enforcement agencies to perform active assailant movement techniques.
- **New Subsection**
 - In a school district in this State which has more than 50,000 pupils enrolled, the board of trustees of each school district shall develop a plan to:
 - Facilitate the coordination of active assailant trainings with other law enforcement agencies and public safety organizations, school administrators and appropriate staff personnel.
 - Use trauma-informed and age-appropriate recommendations to develop school-based strategies for supporting students exposed to community violence.
 - Use trauma-informed recommendations to develop school-based strategies for supporting faculty and staff members exposed to community violence.
 - Review general communication structures to parents and guardians during an emergency, including notification via text, email, or other school-based applications.
 - At least twice per academic year, send a notice to parents and guardians regarding safe storage requirements outlined per NRS statutes.

Section 9

Subsection 2(7)(f): strike “including, without limitation, drills concerning active shooter preparedness.”
