**SENATE BILL 338**

**Revises provisions relating to off-highway vehicles. (BDR 43-678)**

**Sponsored By:** Senator Flores  
**Date Heard:** April 5, 2023  
**Fiscal Notes:** Effect on Local Government: No.  
Effect on the State: Yes.

**Senate Bill 338** authorizes the use of certain off-highway or "utility vehicles" on public roadways to allow access to and from public and private areas that are open for use by off-highway vehicles and removes the authority of a governing city or county to prohibit the operation of a utility vehicle unless the designated speed limit is more than 45 miles per hour. The utility vehicle must be registered with the Department of Motor Vehicles.

**Amendments:**

An amendment was proposed by Senator Flores to delete the existing provisions of the bill and instead revise the definition of "large all-terrain vehicle."
