Oppose SB423

There are several reasons why one might oppose revising provisions relating to penalties for driving without a motorcycle driver's license, motorcycle endorsement or permit to operate a motorcycle, establishing certain requirements for the renewal of a motorcycle endorsement to a driver's license, and revising certain requirements for instructors for the Program for the Education of Motorcycle Riders.

Firstly, increasing penalties for driving without a motorcycle driver's license or endorsement could unfairly punish individuals who may not have had the opportunity to obtain the necessary license or endorsement due to financial or logistical barriers. This could disproportionately impact low-income individuals and those living in rural areas with limited access to testing facilities.

Secondly, imposing additional requirements for the renewal of a motorcycle endorsement to a driver's license could create unnecessary bureaucracy and inconvenience for licensed motorcyclists. These requirements may not necessarily contribute to improved safety on the roadways and may instead serve as a hindrance to law-abiding motorcyclists.

Thirdly, revising certain requirements for instructors for the Program for the Education of Motorcycle Riders could limit the pool of qualified instructors and increase costs for those seeking motorcycle training. This could make it more difficult for individuals to obtain the necessary training and certification to obtain a motorcycle license or endorsement.

Furthermore, it is important to consider the potential unintended consequences of such revisions, such as creating a burden on law enforcement and the court system, or deterring individuals from obtaining the necessary training and licensing altogether. Ultimately, the safety of all road users is paramount, but any revisions to motorcycle licensing and training regulations should be carefully considered and balanced against potential costs and unintended consequences.
