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NOTICE OF INTENT TO ACT UPON A REGULATION

Notice of Hearing for the Amendment of Regulations of the Board of Health (LCB File No. R111-22)

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the State Board of Health will hold a public hearing at 9:00 a.m. on December 2, 2022, in conjunction with the State Board of Health meeting. The purpose of the hearing is to receive comments from all interested persons regarding the Amendment of regulations that pertain to Chapter 440 of Nevada Administrative Code (NAC), Vital Statistics.

The State Board of Health meeting will be conducted via videoconference beginning at 9:00 a.m. on Wednesday, December 2, 2022, at the following locations:

The following information is provided pursuant to the requirements of NRS 233B.0603.

The changes to NAC 440 in LCB File No. R111-22 are to remove obstacles for advancement that no longer serve the public's best interest and include the following changes:

- Clarifying the English Replacement of a Foreign Birth Certificate
- Clarifying ID requirements for Declarations of Paternity/Parentage
- Clarifying how to fill out the cause of death
- Aligning deadlines for medical certifiers to sign death certificates with existing law
- Clarifying who is responsible to sign a death certificate once the coroner relinquishes jurisdiction
- Clarifying the responsibility of transferring death records from one funeral home to another



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- Clarifying gender identity options and the evidence needed to change it once the record has been registered
- Clarified the delayed birth process and evidence required
- Clarified the non-refundable status of fees once services have been rendered
- Removal of the notary services from regulation
- 1. Anticipated effects on the business which NAC 440 regulates:

- 6. The proposed regulations do not establish a new fee or increase an existing fee.

If no person who is directly affected by the proposed action appears to request time to make an oral presentation, the Board of Health may proceed immediately to act upon any written submissions
