Private Investigator's Licensing Board compliance summary per Senate Bill No. 420.

The Private Investigator's Licensing Board is the regulatory agency for issuing a state license to Private Investigators, Private Patrolman, Process Servers, Repossessors, Canine Handlers and Polygraph Examiners. The authority for this Board is Nevada Revised Statute 648 and Nevada Administrative Code 648.

The Board's quarterly meeting was on June 11, 2002 in Reno, Nevada. The Board agenda reflected two (2) appeal hearings on unlicensed activity and one disciplinary hearing on a licensee. The first appeal first was heard and the Board voted to support the appeal and the person was let off on a warning. The second was on an unlicensed activity citation. After the Board heard the evidence, they voted to uphold the issuance of the unlicensed activity citation and instructed the party to pay the \$2500 fine.

The disciplinary hearing was on a licensee who had repeatedly been fined by the State of Nevada Labor Commission for nonpayment of wages to his employees. The Board executed the terms by which the licensee had to pay his fines and the wages of his employees. His license was placed on probation.

The Boards next quarterly meeting was on September 12, 2002, in Reno, Nevada. The Board agenda did reflect one unlicensed activity appeal. It was requested that the appeal be continued until the December 4, 2002, meeting in Las Vegas, Nevada. The Board granted that request.
