## QUARTERLY DISCIPLINARY REPORT TO LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL BUREAU

The Board filed a complaint on June 13, 2006 following an audit being conducted to ensure compliance with requirements for continuing education. The complaint was investigated and it was determined that Dr. Francis' conduct violated: NRS 638.1402, in misrepresenting information to secure a license.

The Board Order stated that: 1) The Licensee shall take an additional fifteen (15) hours of continuing education by December, 30, 2006 and shall provide to the Board written proof of the completion of these hours by January 31, 2007. These hours must be over and above those that are required by state law. 2) The Licensee shall be audited, at a minimum, from 2007-2009 and shall be required to provide supporting documentation proving that he has participated in at least 15 hours of completion of continuing education during the 12 months immediately preceding the beginning of the new licensing year. 3) The Licensee will pay attorney fees, investigative costs, and Board costs of \$250.00 and a fine of \$500.00.

A consumer complaint was filed with the Board on May 4, 2006. The complaint was investigated and it was determined that Dr. Moore had violated: NAC 638.0175 and NAC 638.057, in failing to establish a VCPR by examining the animals prior to delegating any tasks to a licensed veterinary technician.

The Board Order stated that: 1) The Licensee must take and pass the Nevada State jurisprudence examination. 2) The Licensee must take an additional two (2) hours of continuing education in professional ethics. 3) The Licensee will pay attorney fees, investigative costs, and Board costs of \$250.00.
