## INTRODUCTORY REMARKS FOR BILL SPONSOR

### SENATE BILL 159

Requires both public and private schools to adopt policies concerning safe sun exposure.

### INTRODUCTORY REMARKS:

Thank you, (Mr./Madam) President. This bill requires the board of trustees of each school district and the governing bodies of each charter and private school to adopt a policy concerning safe sun exposure. The policy must:

- Provide that sunscreen not be considered a medication sold over the counter; and
- Allow a student who participates in certain outdoor activities to wear protective clothing and possess and self-administer sunscreen.

The bill also authorizes the policy to include teaching students best practices for safe sun exposure to reduce the risk of skin cancer. Further, whenever possible a policy requiring students to wear school uniforms must be consistent with policies relating to safe sun exposure.
