## PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE BOARD OF WILDLIFE COMMISSIONERS

### NOTICE OF INTENT TO ACT UPON A REGULATION Notice of Hearing for The Amendment of Regulations of The Nevada Board of Wildlife Commissioners

The Board of Wildlife Commissioners will hold a public hearing at 8:30 a.m. on July 24, 1999, at the Great Basin College, 1500 College Parkway, Greenhaw Technical Building, Room 130, Elko, Nevada. The purpose of the hearing is to receive comments from all interested persons regarding the adoption of regulation CGR 279 pertaining to Chapter 502 of the Nevada Administrative Code.

- 1. The need for and purpose of the proposed regulation: Due to recent changes in federal rules governing the take of swan, specific reference to "tundra" is no longer necessary as it would place hunters in jeopardy of violating the law. The provisions regarding mandatory inspection of harvested swans have historically been handled in season and limit regulations, however, it is more appropriately placed in permanent regulation due to the long-term nature of the requirement. The purpose of the regulation is to eliminate criminal jeopardy for lawful hunters who inadvertently harvest a species of swan other than tundra swan, and to provide for the mandatory inspection of a harvested swan in order to monitor the take of trumpeter swans has been reached.

<u>Commission General Regulation Number 277:</u> Proposes to amend Chapter 503 of the Nevada Administrative Code by prohibiting hunting for the period of 96 hours after flying over a big game management unit.

<u>Commission General Regulation Number 279:</u> Proposes to amend NAC 502.380 by deleting the reference to "tundra" as it applies to the hunting of swan; and establishes a provision for the mandatory inspection of a harvested swan.

<u>Commission General Regulation Number 280:</u> Proposes to amend NAC 504.340 by correcting the names of national wildlife refuges and other federally administered properties; deleting information which is outdated.

# PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE BOARD OF WILDLIFE COMMISSIONERS

#### **COMMISSION GENERAL REGULATION 279**

Authority: NRS 501.105, 501.181

Notice of Intent: June, 1999 Workshop Date: July 24, 1999 Commission Approval: July , 1999

EXPLANATION: This regulation proposes to amend NAC 502.380 by deleting the reference to "tundra" as it applies to the hunting of swan; and establishes a provision for the mandatory inspection of a harvested swan.

NOTE: Matter in *italics* is new; matter within brackets  $\vdash$  is to be omitted.

**Section 1.** NAC 502.380 is hereby amended to read as follows:

#### Tundra swan tags.

- 1. A tag is required to hunt [tundra] *a* swan. The fee for the tag is \$5. A person may obtain a form to apply for the tag from a license agent or an office of the division. The form must be completed in accordance with the instructions thereon. The division's award of these tags will be based on a drawing held after the deadline specified on the form.
- 2. Each person while hunting [tundra] swan shall carry on his person, in addition to a state duck stamp and a federal migratory bird hunting stamp, if required, [a] an annual hunting license and a [tundra] swan tag issued by the division.
- 3. When a hunter has killed a [tundra] swan and taken it into his possession, he shall immediately punch and attach the tag in the manner required by NAC 502.390 and 502.400.
- 4. Unless otherwise specified by a season and bag regulation of the commission, a person who harvests a swan shall, within 5 days after harvesting it, personally present the head and

neck of the swan to a representative of the division for inspection. The location of inspection sites will be provided with the tag when issued to the tagholder.

[4.] 5. A person shall not use or possess a tag issued to any other person, or transfer or give a tag issued to him to any other person.
