PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE COMMISSION ON PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS IN EDUCATION

Explanation: Matter in Italics is new; matter in brackets \vdash is material to be omitted.

AUTHORITY: NRS 391.019

Chapter 391 of NAC is hereby amended as follows:

Section 1.

NAC 391.192 Endorsement to teach computer literacy.

- 1. [Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, t] To receive an endorsement on or after August [September] 1, [1990] 2000, to teach [computer literacy] concepts, skills, and basic operations in kindergarten through grade 12, a person must have a valid elementary, secondary or special license and complete:
 - (a) A program, which has been approved by the board, for teaching the use of a computer; or
- (b) [Except as otherwise provided in this paragraph,] Six (6) semester hours in [courses of study] coursework which include the following:
- (1) Methods for teaching the use of a computer or educational issues related to computers (or both); and
 - (2) An introduction to using:
 - (I) The computer keyboard *and printer*;
 - (II) Basic operating commands;
 - (III) Computer [vocabulary] terminology; and
 - (IV) [Available] Review of educational software.

[A certificate from a university verifying the knowledge and skills of the applicant will be accepted in lieu of credit.

2. If the applicant has a limited endorsement to teach computer literacy, he must complete at least 6 semester hours of computer-related course work by the end of the term of the limited endorsement to receive an endorsement pursuant to this section.]

Section 2.

NAC 391.202 Endorsement to teach computer applications.

- 1. [Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, t] To receive an endorsement on or after August [September] 1, [1990] 2000, to teach computer-based applications that include tools for productivity, communication, and research, as well as implications and issues of educational technology in kindergarten through grade 12, a person must have a valid elementary, secondary or special license and complete:
- (a) A program, which has been approved by the board, for teaching computer-based applications; or
 - (b) Twelve hours in [courses of study] coursework which include the following:
- (1) [Methods for teaching the use of a computer or e] Educational issues and computers; [, or both; and]
 - (2) Methods for teaching the integration of technology with curriculum; and
- [(2)] (3) [Methods for teaching] A program which has been approved and provides course work in computer applications or instruction in [at least two] three of the following computer-based applications [packages, or both]:
 - (I) Productivity Tools such as Word processing, databases and spreadsheets.
 - (II) [Databases] Communication Tools.
 - (III) [Spreadsheets] Research Tools.
 - (IV) [Telecommunications] Multimedia Tools.
 - (V) Other applications not identified in (I) through (IV) [Graphics.
- (VI) Integration.
- (VII) Desktop publishing.
- [2. If the applicant has a limited endorsement to teach computer applications, he must complete at least 9 semester hours of computer-related work by the end of the term of the limited endorsement to receive an endorsement pursuant to this section.]

The following regulations are hereby repealed effective September 1, 2000:

[NAC 391.194 Limited endorsement to teach computer literacy.

- 1. A teacher may receive a limited endorsement to teach computer literacy if he has:
- (a) A valid elementary, secondary or special license; and
- (b) Taught at least one period of computer literacy for at least 1 school year.
- 2. This limited endorsement is valid for 5 years and is not renewable.]

[NAC 391.204 Limited endorsement to teach computer applications.

- 1. A teacher may receive a limited endorsement to teach computer applications if he has:
- (a) A valid elementary, secondary or special license; and
- (b) Taught at least one period of computer applications for at least 1 school year.
- 2. This limited endorsement is valid for 5 years and is not renewable.]
