NOTICE OF PUBLIC WORKSHOP AND PUBLIC HEARING

The attached proposed emergency revisions to Nevada Administrative Code 584.6482 were heard at a public workshop in Reno on August 19, 1999, and are scheduled for final public hearing on September 16, 1999 in Las Vegas. On September 16, the Dairy Commission will adopt the proposed regulation and forward it to the Governor's office for emergency approval so that the provisions will be effective on October 1, 1999.

At that time, the Commission plans to have two additional public forums to add the regulations as a permanent addition to NAC: a public workshop scheduled for October 21, 1999 in Reno and a final public hearing scheduled for November 18, 1999 in Las Vegas.

Notice of Public Workshop for the Amendment of Regulations of the Dairy Commission

The Nevada State Dairy Commission will hold a public workshop during its regularly scheduled meeting at 9:00 a.m., on Thursday, August 19, 1999, at Kietzke Plaza, 4600 Kietzke Lane, Building B, Room 111. The purpose of the workshop is to receive comments from all interested persons regarding the amendment of regulations that pertain to Chapter 584 of the *Nevada Administrative Code* (NAC), specifically regarding NAC 584.6482 which references the establishment of minimum prices for fluid milk and fluid cream to be paid by distributors to producers in the Southern Nevada Marketing Area (Clark, Lincoln, and Nye counties).

Pending federal legislation may exempt Clark County, Nevada from minimum price regulation by the Federal Milk Marketing Order program on October 1, 1999. Should the legislation pass, the Dairy Commission would assume primary authority for minimum price regulation. The Commission is seeking public comment regarding how the minimum price for fluid milk and fluid cream should be set in Clark County, Nevada.

Persons wishing to comment upon the proposed action of the Nevada State Dairy Commission may appear at the scheduled public hearing or may address their comments, data, views, or arguments, in written form, to Ms. Stacy M. Jennings, Executive Director, Nevada State Dairy Commission, 4600 Kietzke Lane, Suite A107, Reno, NV 89502. Written submissions must be received by the Nevada State Dairy Commission on or before August 12, 1999. If no person who is directly affected by the proposed action appears to request time to make an oral presentation, the Nevada State Dairy Commission may proceed immediately to act upon any written submissions.

PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE DAIRY COMMISSION

Establishment of Prices for Dairy Products

Section 1. NAC 584.6482 is hereby amended to read as follows:

584.6482 Establishment of minimum price for fluid milk and fluid cream to be paid by distributor to producer.

- 1. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the minimum price for fluid milk and fluid cream to be paid by a distributor to a producer located in the western Nevada marketing area, except a producer located in zone 9 of the western Nevada marketing area, is the minimum price established for fluid milk and fluid cream [as of August 26, 1996,] set every two months by the State of California Department of Food and Agriculture for the northern California marketing area. [Iff] When the minimum price for fluid milk and fluid cream established for the northern California marketing area is revised, the commission will review the revised price to determine whether it is acceptable. Unless the commission, within 5 days after the price for the northern California marketing area is revised, determines that the revised price is unacceptable, the revised price for the northern California marketing area shall be deemed the minimum price for fluid milk and fluid cream to be paid by a distributor to a producer located in the western Nevada marketing area, except a producer located in zone 9 of the western Nevada marketing area. The minimum price for fluid milk and fluid cream to be paid by a distributor to a producer located in the western Nevada marketing area, except a producer located in zone 9 of the western Nevada marketing area, may be obtained at no cost:

- 2. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the minimum price for fluid milk and fluid cream to be paid by a distributor to a producer located in [the southern Nevada marketing area,] the eastern Nevada marketing area [or zone 9 of the western Nevada marketing area], except a producer located in zone 5 of the eastern Nevada marketing area, is the minimum price for fluid milk and fluid cream established for those areas [as of August 26, 1996,] and set each month in the Federal Milk Marketing Orders. [Iff] When the minimum price for fluid milk and fluid cream established in the Federal Milk Marketing Orders for [the southern Nevada marketing area,] the eastern Nevada marketing area [or zone 9 of the western Nevada marketing area] is revised, the commission will review the revised price to determine whether it is acceptable. Unless the commission, within 5 days after the price established in the Federal Milk Marketing Orders is revised, determines that the revised price is unacceptable, the revised price set forth in the Federal Milk Marketing Orders shall be deemed the minimum price for fluid milk

and fluid cream to be paid by a distributor to a producer located in the [marketing area for which the price was revised] eastern Nevada marketing area, except a producer located in zone 5 of the eastern Nevada marketing area. A copy of the Federal Milk Marketing Orders may be obtained at no cost:

- 3. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the minimum price for fluid milk and fluid cream to be paid by a distributor located in the southern Nevada marketing area, zone 5 of the eastern Nevada marketing area, or zone 9 of the western Nevada marketing area to a producer shall be the basic formula price, or in the absence of a basic formula price the class III price, set each month by the United States Department of Agriculture, plus a class differential established by the Dairy Commission. The minimum price for fluid milk and fluid cream to be paid by a distributor located in the southern Nevada marketing area, zone 5 of the eastern Nevada marketing area, or zone 9 of the western Nevada marketing area to a producer may be obtained at no cost:

Section 2. Section 1 of this regulation is effective on an emergency basis from and after October 1, 1999, providing that S. 1233, which exempts Clark County, Nevada from the Federal Milk Marketing Order Program, is passed by the United States Congress and is signed into law by the President of the United States.
