PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE STATE BOARD OF

PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERS AND LAND SURVEYORS

AUTHORITY: §§1 and 2, NRS 625.140.

Section 1. Chapter 625 of NAC is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

- 1. Any person not properly licensed or exempted in accordance with the provisions of chapter 625 of NRS who employs, uses or causes to be used the term "engineer," "engineering" or "engineered" shall include the disclosure required pursuant to subparagraph (3) of paragraph (a) of subsection 1 of NRS 625.520 in any material distributed to or in any communication with the public, including, without limitation:
 - (a) A business or identification card;
 - (b) Any stationery or letterhead;
 - (c) A written or oral solicitation or offer to perform services;
 - (d) An advertisement; or
 - (e) Any other document or communication to a member of the public.
- 2. Any corporation which is not properly licensed or exempted in accordance with the provisions of chapter 625 of NRS and which is using the term "engineer," "engineering" or "engineered" in its corporate name shall include in its written statement required pursuant to

paragraph (b) of subsection 4 of NRS 625.520 a description of the type of work performed by the corporation.

- 3. Any corporation that is not properly licensed or exempted in accordance with the provisions of chapter 625 of NRS shall not advertise in a manner or place which indicates or implies that the corporation is licensed, qualified or authorized to practice engineering in this state.
 - **Sec. 2.** NAC 625.647 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 625.647 1. If the board establishes an advisory committee for the evaluation and disposition of a complaint, the advisory committee shall:
- (a) Review the complaint and the written report submitted pursuant to subsection 2 of NAC 625.640 to determine whether there is probable cause to believe that the respondent violated NRS [645.410;] 625.410;
- (b) Hold an informal conference with the respondent and any other person who may assist in resolving the complaint;
 - (c) Attempt to arrive at a resolution of the complaint with the respondent; and
- (d) Within 15 days after the conclusion of the informal conference, submit to the executive director a report containing written recommendations regarding the disposition of the complaint.
- 2. In addition to the report required by paragraph (d) of subsection 1, within 15 days after the conclusion of the informal conference, the chairman of the advisory committee shall submit to the board a report which contains a summary of the informal conference and recommendations regarding the disposition of the complaint.
- 3. The board is not bound by any recommendation made by an advisory committee regarding the disposition of the complaint.
