## ADOPTED TEMPORARY REGULATION OF THE NEVADA STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION

(Effective April 28, 1999)

Explanation: Matter in *Italics* is new; matter in brackets [] is material to be omitted.

**Section 1.** NAC 392.500 is hereby amended to read as follows:

NAC 392.500 Conformity with minimal national standards required.

- 1. Every school bus purchased:
- (a) After February 10, 1972, and before March 1, 1996, for the transportation of pupils must conform to the minimum national standards for school buses established by the Secretary of Transportation pursuant to the National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act of 1966 (15 U.S.C. §§ 1381 et seq.), and any more stringent standards adopted by the state board of education that were in effect at the time the school bus was [purchased] *manufactured*; or
- (b) On or after March 1, 1996, must conform to the national standards for school buses set forth in 49 C.F.R. Part 571 and the National Standards for School Transportation, 1995 edition, and the more stringent standards set forth in NAC 392.501 to 392.689, inclusive.
- 2. Nothing in this section shall be construed to prevent the Federal Government or the government of any state or political subdivision thereof from establishing a safety requirement applicable to motor vehicles or motor vehicle equipment procured for its own use if such requirement imposes a higher standard of performance than that required to comply with the otherwise applicable federal standard.
  - **Sec. 2.** NAC 392.501 is hereby amended to read as follows:

NAC 392.501 Applicability of regulations. NAC 392.501 to 392.621, inclusive, apply to all school buses, unless:

- 1. A different standard is required pursuant to NAC 392.647 to 392.689, inclusive, for school buses designed to transport pupils with disabilities; or
- 2. As set forth in paragraph (a) of subsection 1 of NAC 392.500, different standards were in effect at the time the school bus was [purchased] *manufactured*.
