# NOTICE OF INTENT TO ACT UPON A REGULATION Notice of Hearing for The Adoption and Amendment of Regulations of The Nevada Board Of Wildlife Commissioners

The Board of Wildlife Commissioners will hold a public hearing at 9:00 a.m., on March 18, 2000, at Nevada Division of Wildlife, Headquarters Office, 1100 Valley Road, Reno, Nevada. The purpose of the hearing is to receive comments from all interested persons regarding the adoption of regulation CGR 281 (LCB File R\_\_\_\_\_) pertaining to Chapter 504 of the Nevada Administrative Code.

- 1. The need for and purpose of the proposed regulation: To allow camping, build campfires and bonfires on the Bruneau wildlife management area.
- 2. Text of the proposed regulation: See attached

# STATE OF NEVADA <u>PROPOSED</u> REGULATION OF THE BOARD OF WILDLIFE COMMISSIONERS COMMISSION GENERAL REGULATION 281

Authority: 504.140 & 504.145 Notice of Intent: February 16, 2000 Workshop Date: March 17, 2000

Commission Approval:

EXPLANATION: Proposes to amend NAC 504.140 and NAC 504.145 to allow camping, campfires and bonfires on the Bruneau wildlife management area.

NOTE: Matter in *italics* is new; matter within brackets  $\vdash$  is to be omitted.

#### Sec. 2 NAC 504.140 is hereby amended to read as follows:

- (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, campfires and bonfires are prohibited in wildlife management areas.
  - (2) Campfires and bonfires are permitted in the:
  - (a) Wayne E. Kirch wildlife management area within the Hot Creek Campground.
  - (b) Humboldt wildlife management area within the Quilici Landing Campground.
  - (c) Fernley wildlife management area.
  - (d) Stillwater wildlife management area.
  - (e) Mason Valley wildlife management area in those sites designated for camping.
  - (f) Overton wildlife management area in those sites designated for camping.
  - (g) Bruneau Wildlife Management Area.

### **Sec. 3 NAC 504.145** is hereby amended to read as follows:

- 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, camping is prohibited in wildlife management areas.
  - 2. Camping is permitted in the:
  - (a) Mason Valley wildlife management area at sites designated by the division.

- (b) Wayne E. Kirch wildlife management area within the Hot Creek Campground.
- (c) Humboldt wildlife management area.
- (d) Fernley wildlife management area.
- (e) Overton wildlife management area within the sites designated for camping.
- (f) Stillwater wildlife management area.
- (g) Bruneau Wildlife Management Area, except in any existing building or structure.
- 3. Camping facilities, including hourse trailers, must not be stored, parked or maintained on a wildlife management area for more than 8 days, or left on an area for occasional occupancy by a person or group of persons associated with the facility.
- 4. The erection, fabrication or maintenance of a permanent dwelling or building on a wildlife management area is prohibited.
