NOTICE AND INTENT TO ADOPT REGULATIONS

THE NEVADA DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO NAC 555 PERTAINING TO NURSERY LICENSE FEES.

Need and purpose of the proposed amendments:

NRS 555 was amended and fees that were set by statute were changed to be set by regulation.

The legislature also passed the 4540 Plant Industry budget with the requirement that the additional cost of monitoring incoming nursery stock shall be paid for by nursery licensing fees in FY2001.

Economic effect of these proposed amendments on the businesses which it is to regulate:

1. Adverse effects:

The fees will increase the cost to businesses, but will not cause an active business to go out of business. The fees include a hardship provision to help prevent this.

2. Beneficial effects:

Business will benefit from the continuing education provided.

3. Immediate and long-term economic effects:

The adverse and beneficial effects are the same for immediate and long-term economic effects.

Economic effect of the proposed amendments on the public:

1. Adverse effects:

None

2. Beneficial effects:

The public protection will be increased through the prevention of the entry and establishment of invasive species that have detrimental economic, environmental and public health effects.

3. Immediate and long-term effects:

The adverse and beneficial effects are the same for the immediate and long-term economic effects.

Economic costs to the agency for the enforcement of the proposed amendments:

The additional costs of enforcement will be paid by the increase in nursery license fees.

Description of any regulations of any other state, local or federal regulation that the proposed amendments overlap or duplicate:

There are no other state, local, or federal government regulations that these amendments overlap or duplicate.

Fees:

The proposed amendments increase fees. A total of \$106,280 will be collected with the new fees. The funds will be used to pay the costs of an two employees, one to assist in nursery inspection and the other to a peace officer and enforce the quarantine and nursery laws and regulations at border inspection sights and delivery locations, operating, and travel to conduct the program.

Proposed amendment to NAC 555 pertaining to nursery license fee.

Authority: NRS 555.238

CHAPTER 555 NAC IS HERE BY AMENDED BY ADDING A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Nursery license fees.

- 1. The minimum license fee, \$130. In addition to the minimum fee the following additional fees shall be added:
 - 1. Per each additional location, \$130
 - 2 Per each acre of nursery stock in production, \$10 per acre up to a maximum fee of \$200.
 - 3. Per each agent acting on behalf of a licensed nursery, \$25.
- B. The license fee for a peddler is \$200.
- C. Hardship declaration and fee.
 - 1. An applicant for licensing may request a hardship fee reduction by writing the Director of the Department of Agriculture and stating the amount of income received from the sales of nursery stock. The Director may grant a hardship fee reduction if he determines that paying the established fee would cause the business to cease operating or not be able to began operating.
 - 2. If a hardship is granted by the Director the minimum license fee will be \$50. In addition to the minimum fee the following additional fees shall be added: \$20 per additional location; \$2 per acre of nursery stock in production up to a maximum fee of \$20; \$5 per agent and \$100 peddler license fee.
