NOTICE OF INTENT TO ACT UPON A REGULATION Notice of Hearing for The Amendment of Regulations of The Nevada Board Of Wildlife Commissioners

The Board of Wildlife Commissioners will hold a public hearing atm., on June 17, 2000 at the Churchill County Community Chambers, 155 North Taylor, Suite 145, Fallon, Nevada. The purpose of the hearing is to receive comments from all interested persons regarding the adoption of regulation CGR 291 (LCB File R085-00) pertaining to Chapter 502 of the Nevada Administrative Code.

- 1. The need for and purpose of the proposed regulation: To clarify where and when an elk incentive tag may be used.
- **2. Text of the proposed regulation:** See attached.
- 3A. The estimated economic effect of the regulation on the business which it is to regulate:
 - (a) Adverse effect May reduce somewhat the market value of a special elk incentive tag in certain situations.
 - **(b) Beneficial effect** Elk incentive tags offer substantial economic benefits to participating landowners.
 - (c) Immediate effect May mean an additional \$10,000 to \$20,000 of income per year on average to participating landowners.
 - (d) **Long-term effect** Potential long term positive economic effect on participating landowners.

STATE OF NEVADA PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE BOARD OF WILDLIFE COMMISSIONERS COMMISSION GENERAL REGULATION 291

(LCB File #R085-00)

Authority: NRS 501.105, 501.181 & 502.142

EXPLANATION: The following language is being proposed to define when and where an elk incentive tag may be used upon issuance by the Division.

NOTE: Matter in *italics* is new; matter within brackets [] is to be omitted.

Section 1. NAC 502.42279 is hereby amended to read as follows:

502.42279 1. The division will award special incentive elk tags based on the following formula:

where:

NP = The number of elk using the private land of the landowner applicant.

NE = The total number of elk in the actual elk use area in which the private land is located.

DP = The number of days the elk use the private land during the year.

NT = The total number of bull elk tags that were issued during the previous year in the unit or units within the management area or areas in which the private land is located.

- 2. A group of landowners, lessees or managers may apply to receive special incentive elk tags for their combined private lands. The group may allocate the tags among the members of the group at their discretion.
- 3. The issuance of special incentive elk tags will not result in a reduction of the total number of bull elk tags issued to the public during a year below the quota for bull elk tags established by the commission for 1997, which was 186 tags.

- 4. A special incentive elk tag is valid for both sexes of elk.
- 5. A landowner applicant to whom a special incentive elk tag is issued pursuant to this section may:
 - (a) Use the tag himself if he holds a valid hunting license issued from this state; or
- (b) Transfer the tag to another person who holds a valid hunting license issued from this state for any price upon which the parties mutually agree.
- 6. The division will charge the same fees for a special incentive elk tag and for the processing of an application for a special incentive elk tag that are charged for an elk tag and for the processing of an application for an elk tag set forth in NRS 502.250.
- 7. At the time of application for a special incentive elk tag, the resident or nonresident applicant, from the current season and bag regulations, select only one hunt from the established resident archery, resident muzzle-loader, or resident any legal weapon hunts for antlered elk for the area described in the cooperative agreement.
- [7.] 8. A person possessing a valid special incentive elk tag shall hunt only:
 - (a) During an open season for bull elk, as specified on the tag;
 - (b) With the weapon designated for that season; and
 - (c) In the unit or units within the management area or areas in which the private land is located.
