## PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE BOARD OF WILDLIFE COMMISSIONERS

### **Commission General Regulation 325**

**EXPLANATION:** The proposed regulation delineates operation requirements for shooting preserves.

SECTION 1. CHAPTER 504 OF NAC is hereby adding thereto provisions set forth in sections 1 to 4, inclusive, of this regulation:

NAC 504 Section 1. Before any shooting may be done on such commercial or private shooting preserve, the licensee must advise the Department, in writing, of the number of each species of upland game bird reared, purchased or acquired for liberation, and request, and receive in writing, a shooting authorization which states the number of each species which may be taken by shooting.

- Sec. 2. Birds must be at least 8 weeks of age, full winged, and in a condition to go wild before liberation.
- Sec. 3. The licensee, or with his written permit the holder thereof, may take such upland game bird from such licensed preserve by shooting only, from August 1 to April 30, inclusive.
- Sec. 4. Permits to hunt on such licensed preserve may be used only on the date of issuance, and the hunter must carry the permit on his person at all times while on the area and while in possession of birds taken on such area.
