NOTICE OF INTENT TO ADOPT REGULATIONS AND NOTICE OF HEARING

Proposed amendment of NAC 555.010, pertaining to Noxious Weed List.

Need and purpose of the proposed amendments: To list all species of an already listed genus, *Tamarix*; currently only two species, *T. ramossissima* and *T. parviflora* are listed. Current research shows other species are hybridizing and becoming invasive or potentially invasive.

Economic effect of these proposed amendments on the businesses which it is to regulate:

- 1. Adverse effects: Minimal impact to the nursery industry. *Tamarix* is currently listed as noxious and sales are regulated for two species. Many nurseries currently do not sell tamarisk.
- 2. Beneficial effects: *Tamarix* has been shown to be highly invasive in riparian habitats; listing all species will eliminate any plants currently being sold as 'spp.' Potential for increased control efforts, ie, pesticide applicators.
- 3. Immediate and long term effects: Immediate and long term effects include reducing populations of an invasive, noxious plant species and thereby diminishing their detrimental effects on sensitive areas throughout the state.
