Sec. 2. NAC 483.820 is hereby amended to read as follows:
483.820 1. On or after July 1, 1990, the Department will, upon the payment of the
required fee, issue to every qualified applicant a commercial driver's license containing:

- (a) The prominent statement that the license is a commercial driver's license;
- (b) The full name, signature and mailing address of the licensee;
- (c) Physical and other information to identify and describe the licensee, including his date of birth, sex and height;
  - (d) A front view color photograph of the licensee;
- (e) A unique driver's license number, assigned to the licensee in a manner consistent with the requirements set forth in NRS 483.345;
  - (f) [The licensee's social security number, unless he requests that it not appear on the license;
- —(g)] The prominent display of the word Nevada;
  - (g) The date of issuance and the date of expiration of the license;
- [(i)] (h) The class or type of the vehicle to be operated, including an endorsement obtained pursuant to 49 C.F.R. § 383.93 that the licensee is authorized to operate that type of vehicle; and [(i)] (i) Any restriction placed on the licensee by the Department.
- 2. A person may attach to his driver's license a document which identifies him as a donor of all or any part of his body pursuant to NRS 451.500 to 451.590, inclusive.

#### INFORMATIONAL STATEMENT

The Department of Motor Vehicles noticed and held a public workshop and public hearing on March 23, 2006, in Carson City, to solicit comments and opinion on proposed regulations to revise language pertaining to the demerits assessed upon conviction of traffic violations; repealing regulations pertaining to the issuance of a commercial driver's license medical waiver; and revising language with regards to the placement of a social security number on the face of a driver's license to ensure compliance with the Intelligence Reform and Terrorist Prevention Act of 2004. Copies of the proposed regulations were available by contacting the Department at (775) 684-4778 or through the mail, 555 Wright Way, Carson City, Nevada 89711.

The notice of the public workshop and hearing and complete copies of the proposed temporary regulations were posted on or before February 17, 2006, at the Nevada State Library and Archives and each office of the Department of Motor Vehicles. In each county where the Department does not maintain an office, the notice was posted at the main office of the public library.

A public workshop and hearing was held at 9:00 a.m. on March 23, 2006 in Carson City. Twenty-one people were in attendance and sixteen of the attendees offered testimony concerning the proposed regulation. Two people submitted written comments prior to the hearing date.

Based on testimony received at the public workshop/hearing, the Department will adopt only Sections 3 and 4 of the amended proposed regulation with no additional changes made. Sections 1, 2 and 5 will not be adopted at this time.

There are no adverse economic effects of this regulation to the Department, local authorities or the public.

There are no other state or government regulations that the proposed regulations duplicate.
