PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE COMMISSIONER OF INSURANCE

AMENDED NOTICE OF WORKSHOPS TO SOLICIT COMMENTS ON PROPOSED REGULATIONS

The Department of Business and Industry, Division of Insurance (Division), is proposing new regulations pertaining to current costs of certain publications, special deposits for insurers of workers' compensation, and examiner rates as published by the NAIC. A workshop has been set for **9:00 a.m., on May 4, 2006**, at the offices of the Division, 788 Fairview Drive, Suite 300, Carson City, Nevada 89701. Interested parties may also participate through a simultaneous video-conference conducted at the Bradley Building, 2501 East Sahara Avenue, Manufactured Housing Division Conference Room, 2nd Floor, Las Vegas, Nevada 89104. The purpose of the workshop is to solicit comments from interested persons on the following general topics addressed in the proposed regulations.

- 1. <u>Update Current Costs of Certain Publications</u>. NAC 616B.427 and NAC 616B.606 are amended to update the current costs of certain publications cited in those regulations.
- 2. <u>Establishing Special Deposits for Insurers of Workers' Compensation</u>. NAC 682B.020 is amended to establish special deposits for insurers of workers' compensation. The proposal will increase the amount of the deposit most insurers presently have pledged for benefit of this State for the benefit of claimants of insolvent insurers of workers' compensation policies in the future.
- 3. Remove Reference to Examiner Rates as Published by the NAIC. NAC 679B.0335 is amended to remove reference to examiner rates as published by the National Association of Insurance Commissioners (NAIC). The proposed amendment to NAC 679B.0335 eliminates the reference to posted NAIC rates for examiner compensation. The purpose of removing the reference to examiner rates as published by the NAIC will provide greater latitude in procuring well qualified, competent contract examiner resources.

Notice of Hearing for the Adoption of Regulations of the Department of Business and Industry, Division of Insurance

The Department of Business and Industry, Division of Insurance (Division), will hold a public hearing at **9:00 a.m., on May 4, 2006,** immediately following a public workshop, at the offices of the Division, 788 Fairview Drive, Suite 300, Carson City, Nevada 89701. Interested persons may also participate through a simultaneous video-conference conducted at the Bradley Building, 2501 East Sahara Avenue, Manufactured Housing Division Conference Room, 2nd Floor, Las Vegas, Nevada 89104. The purpose of the hearing is to receive comments from all interested persons regarding the adoption of:

REGULATION CONCERNING AMENDMENT TO NAC 682B.020 ESTABLISHING SPECIAL DEPOSITS FOR INSURERS OF WORKERS' COMPENSATION

The following information is provided pursuant to the requirements of NRS 233B.0603:

1. A statement of the need for and purpose of the proposed regulation:

The purpose of the amendment is to establish a specific amount for special deposits pertinent to workers' compensation insurers. The proposal will increase the amount of the deposit most insurers presently have pledged for benefit of this State for the benefit of claimants of insolvent insurers of workers' compensation policies in the future.

2. Either the terms or substance of the proposed regulation or a description of the subjects and issues involved:

The proposed regulation provides for an increase in the amount of the special deposit provided for under NRS 682B.015 and 682B.010, 682B.020, and 682B.030 of the Nevada Administrative Code for specific application to insurers of workers' compensation insurance written in Nevada.

- 3. Estimated economic effect of the regulation:
 - (I) The net effect upon regulated business will be a requirement to increase the amount of the collateral on deposit with the Commissioner.
 - (II) The estimated economic effect of the regulation will increase the amount of collateral available to the Commissioner for benefit of claimants of insolvent insurers of workers' compensation policies in the future.
- 4. A statement identifying the methods used by the agency in determining the impact on a small

business prepared pursuant to subsection 3 of NRS 233B.0608:

Insurers underwriting workers' compensation coverage in Nevada are not small businesses, therefore the regulation will have no impact upon small businesses.

5. The estimated cost to the agency for enforcement of the proposed regulation:

The Division will not incur additional expense for enforcement of the proposed regulation.

6. A description of any regulations of other state or local governmental agencies which the proposed regulation overlaps or duplicates and a statement explaining why the duplication or overlapping is necessary; if the regulation overlaps or duplicates a federal regulation, the notice must include the name of the regulating federal agency:

The Division is not aware of any overlap or duplication of the regulation with any state, local, or federal regulation.

7. If the regulation is required pursuant to federal law, a citation and description of the federal law:

The proposed regulation is not pursuant to federal law.

8. If the regulation includes provisions which are more stringent than a federal regulation that regulates the same activity, a summary of such provisions:

There are no federal regulations pertaining to examinations of insurers.

9. Include a statement indicating whether the regulation establishes a new fee or increases an existing fee:

The proposed regulation does not establish any new fees or increase any existing fee.

Persons wishing to comment upon the proposed action of the Division may appear at the scheduled public hearing or may address their comments, data, views or arguments, in written form, to the Division, 788 Fairview Drive, Suite 300, Carson City, Nevada 89701. Written submissions must be received by the Division on or before April 27, 2006. If no person who is directly affected by the proposed action appears to request time to make an oral presentation, the Division may proceed immediately to act upon any written submissions.

PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE **COMMISSIONER OF INSURANCE**

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO REGULATION CONCERNING SPECIAL DEPOSITS FOR INSURERS OF WORKERS' COMPENSATION

AUTHORITY: NRS 679B.130

Section 1. NAC 682B.020 is hereby amended to read as follows:

682B.020 1. The commissioner may require any authorized insurer who is subject to the

provisions of chapter 680A of NRS, at the time of or any time after its admission, and any eligible

insurer who is subject to the provisions of chapter 685A of NRS, at the time of becoming or any time

after becoming eligible, to deposit with the commissioner a special deposit. To determine which

insurer will be required to make a special deposit and in what amount, the commissioner will

consider:

(a) The amount of business being transacted or to be transacted in this state by the insurer;

(b) The financial strength of the insurer; and

(c) The ability of the insurer to fulfill its policy obligations.

2. The required amount of the special deposit for insurers of workers' compensation is 2% of the

annual written premium attributed to workers' compensation policies in Nevada as reported in the

insurer's annual financial report but not less than \$100,000.

[2] 3. Any deposit made pursuant to this section must be deposited, released and maintained in

accordance with NRS 682B.015.
