# ADOPTED TEMPORARY REGULATION OF THE BOARD OF WILDLIFE COMMISSIONERS

Filed with the Secretary of State on June 18, 2007

#### **COMMISSION GENERAL REGULATION 348**

**Authority:** NRS 488.045, 488.400, 501.181, and 501.243

**EXPLANATION:** Amends NAC 488.458 Mooring or anchoring of vessels; placement and removal of mooring buoys by deleting section 1 (c) regarding Lake Tahoe mooring AND anchoring areas and moving it to a new section 2 designating areas for mooring (only) and prohibiting anchoring in these mooring areas.

NOTE: Matter in *italics* is new; matter within brackets  $\vdash$  is to be omitted.

**Section. 1.** NAC 488.458 is hereby amended to read as follows:

- 488.458 1. The Commission hereby designates areas for mooring or anchoring vessels within the following locations:
- (a) On Lake Mohave, the location established as Cottonwood Cove by the Superintendent of the Lake Mead National Recreation Area.
  - (b) On Lake Mead, the locations established as:
    - (1) Boulder Harbor;
    - (2) Calville Bay;
    - (3) Echo Bay;
    - (4) Las Vegas Bay; and
    - (5) Overton Beach,

by the Superintendent of the Lake Mead National Recreation Area.

[(c) On Lake Tahoe, Round Hill Pines Beach, Glenbrook Bay and Zephyr Cove Marina located in Douglas County.]

- 2. The Commission hereby designates areas for mooring vessels within the following locations:
  - (a) On Lake Tahoe, the locations in Douglas County established as:
    - (1) Round Hill Pines Beach,
    - (2) Glenbrook Bay, and
    - (3) Zephyr Cove Marina.
  - (b) Vessels are prohibited from anchoring within the mooring area.
- [2.] 3. The areas designated by the Commission pursuant to subsection 1 will be marked pursuant to NRS 488.265.
- [3.] 4. Vessels are prohibited from mooring or anchoring on the Colorado River within the area designated by buoys at Harrah's Casino in Laughlin.
- [4.] 5. The Department will collect a fee of \$30 for the issuance or renewal of a permit to place a mooring buoy in the non-navigable waters of this State.
- [5.] 6. The Department will remove a mooring buoy that is unlawfully placed and, for the removal of such a mooring buoy, assess an administrative fine. The amount of the administrative fine will be \$100 in addition to an amount equal to the cost to the Department of labor and equipment for the removal of the mooring buoy.
