#### ADOPTED REGULATION OF THE

### PERSONNEL COMMISSION

EXPLANATION - Matter in *italics* is new; matter in brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AUTHORITY: §1, NRS 284.065, 284.155, 284.175 and 284.345.

A REGULATION relating to the State Personnel System; revising provisions concerning certain absences; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Section 1.** NAC 284.594 is hereby amended to read as follows:

- 284.594 1. An unauthorized and unreported absence must be considered an absence without leave and a deduction of pay must be made for the absence.
- 2. An *unauthorized or* unreported absence may be considered an absence without leave, and a deduction of pay may be made for the absence.
- 3. An employee who has an unauthorized or unreported absence may be subject to disciplinary action pursuant to NAC **284.646** or 284.650.
- 4. A deduction from the pay of an exempt classified employee or exempt unclassified employee must be made in increments of a full workday.

The Personnel Commission adopted regulations which pertain to chapter 284 of the Nevada Administrative Code on September 25, 2009.
