## PROPOSED REGULATION OF THE BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS

## **LCB File No. R146-10**

NAC 630. \_\_\_ Special event license for visiting physicians. Authority: NRS 630.130, NRS 630.266, NRS 630.268

- 1. The Board may grant a special event license to a physician licensed in another state and who comes to the state of Nevada to conduct demonstrations of medical techniques and procedures in this state, where the applicant:
  - (a) Provides to the Board an application for licensure, in a form approved by the Board for such purposes, and all supporting documentation necessary for the issuance of the special event license, including but not limited to the requirements set forth in NRS 630.165, 630.167, NRS 630.170, NRS 630.171, NRS 630.173, NRS 630.195 and NRS 630.197, as deemed necessary by the Board.
  - (b) Provides proof of licensure and certification of good standing in another state in which he or she is licensed.
  - (c) Pays the fee for the special event license as allowed by NRS 630.268.
  - (d) Discloses the dates and places the related demonstrations will be performed and who will be attending those demonstrations.
- 2. At the time of providing the application for licensure to the Board, the applicant must indicate to the Board the date the licensure is desired to become effective. In order to ensure that adequate time is available to process the application for special event licensure, the physician must complete and furnish to the Board the licensure application and all supporting documentation necessary for the issuance of the special event license at least 30 days in advance of the requested effective date.
- 3. The special event license shall only be valid for the dates on which the demonstrations of medical techniques and procedures are to be accomplished, but under no circumstance, for no more than 15 days after its effective date.
- 4. Upon issuance of the special event license, the licensee is required to prepare and maintain medical records related to any demonstration in accordance with the requirements of Chapters 629 and 630 of the NRS.
- 5. As used in this section, "state" means a state of the United States, the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico or a territory or insular possession subject to the jurisdiction of the United States.
